Eligibility

Agricultural Background

- They or their parent (s) or guardian (s) must have engaged in migrant or seasonal farm work for at least 75 days within the last 24 month.



Eligibility

Any activity directly related to the production of crops, dairy products, poultry, livestock, the cultivation or harvesting of trees, or any activity directly related to fish farms, packaging of and transportation of raw products.
