<p>Equipment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide more and better equipment (updated/new) to do the job • Clarify needed items 	<p><i>Actions</i></p>
<p>Facilities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop a financial feasibility plan • All buildings should be built above grade • New buildings should have a set theme • New buildings should be maintenance friendly • New buildings should be remodel friendly • Do not allow occupancy until building is complete/turned over • Maintain consistency in design and material • Build contemporary buildings • Clean hallways and bathrooms • Maintain all buildings equally • Maintain safe elevators (e.g. Bookstore, Riverfront Center) • Define the elements of a professional work place • Require that each office reflect the professional standard • Develop plans for future University Police Department building -- modern station, i.e. dispatch, safe public reception area, secure restroom, locker room, ID cards • Create a more secure (Public Safety) building—bullet proof lobby windows, fenced secure back gated area (parking for police vehicles), secure detention area, separate non-public bathrooms, exercise room, updated dispatch, separate building from other University departments, improved break area, locker room with attached bathrooms, private report writing area, laptop computers for report writing 	<p><i>Actions</i></p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install a Sally Port secure facility for prisoners, with holding cell, secure interview room • Think of parking issues before adding more buildings • Paint Sequoia Hall to improve appearance and blend with surrounding trees • Brighten Tahoe Hall courtyard by trimming trees, improving benches and changing landscaping to create a peaceful sanctuary • Brighten the Library Entrance with better lighting and ferns to soften the concrete walls. • Install more chain link screens for improved appearance 	
<p>Grounds/Landscaping</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consider staffing required to maintain grounds/landscaping • Select a Mediterranean style for landscaping (low water) -- landscaping consistently will unite campus buildings regardless of building style • Place more art pieces on campus • Plant colorful flowers instead of shrubs • Install new outdoor seating and provide eating areas • Replace/update old tables • Improve landscaping at entrances • Re-landscape the J Street entrance – Remove the pampas grass (not CA native), add color -- maybe by planting annual flowerbeds, as for the Olympic Trials • Repair sidewalk/pathway/surfaces • Identify trees and plants and diversify plant material, similar to an arboretum (people are interested in knowing what they are seeing.) • If there is a horticultural program, have students involved in the grooming of campus landscaping • Install more trash receptacles around campus • Restore the Arboretum, adding seating (currently very run down) • Recycle • Plant more vines and easy maintenance plants in PS1 planters to drape down concrete walls • Replace ivy as ground cover with more current none seventies plants 	<p><i>Actions</i></p>
<p>Partnerships</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish a partnership with the City to clean up the streets/sidewalks/gullies approaching the campus entrances 	<p><i>Actions</i></p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide grid maps of the campus to the fire station across J Street, to help campus dispatchers provide directions 	
<p>Signage/Maps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install new directional signs • Install maps in keys places/buildings • Install (well-lit) street signs • Install “way finder signs” for all buildings • Install lighted police signs • Increase signage to identify and locate the police department • Install a star in front of the University Police Department • Install a sign next to freeway 	<p><i>Actions</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The campus <i>Wayfinder</i> signage project is under way, with new campus entrance signs installed in late spring 2006, and parking lot signage listing nearby buildings installed during the summer. • Sacramento State signs installed on Modoc Hall in 2005/06 are highly visible from Highway 50, especially at night when signs are lit.
<p>Teamwork</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a team approach (monthly) in Housing complex 	<p><i>Actions</i></p>
