Destination 2010 (Process) Goal: Make the campus easy to navigate

<i>Proposed Actions</i>	<i>Progress Report</i>
ADA <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Become more ADA conscious 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The River Front Center has made gender-neutral restrooms available. • The University's sets aside 25 percent of its annual Capital Outlay budget for ADA compliance.
Safety <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Walk the campus at night to assess safety • Install stop signs between parking lots 7 & 8 to and paint cross walks to reduce possibility of accidents 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facilities Services personnel routinely walk the campus at night to assess safety. Public Safety Community Service officers, who are employed during the academic semesters, are tasked with campus night-time safety evaluations.
Grounds <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Re-do the Arboretum (native plants only) 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funds have been committed for clean-up and maintenance of the University Arboretum. Recent tree-trimming work has made the area more inviting to visitors.
Lighting <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Install better/more solar campus lighting 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The University is always looking for energy-saving measures. Energy efficient lighting is installed where cost allows.
Parking <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alter permit machines to accept \$5 and \$10 bills, market and encourage the use of One-Card at machines, elevate machines to shoulder level • Install machine for walk-up customers • Color code parking lots by painting curbs • 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Current permit machines are situated to facilitate use by pedestrians and drivers of vehicles. Some machines do accept five dollar bills and we are working to encourage the use of the One Card.
Signage/Maps/Directions <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve signage and accuracy of signage <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Number buildings ○ Install signs/directional arrow indicator signs ○ Install <i>MASH</i> signs, map kiosks 	<i>Actions</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The campus <i>Way finder</i> signage project is under way, with new campus entrance signs installed in late spring 2006, with parking lot signage including lists of nearby buildings installed during the summer.

- Install automated signs at entrances
- Install signs in each bldg for room numbers and exits for emergency (directions to elevator)
- Install building directories all over campus
- Brighten signs and use painted lines on the ground for directions
- Install signage on main roadways with directions to Housing complex
- Enlarge current housing building signage (located very high up on the buildings—no one can see the signs)
- Install signage for the Housing Office
- Place building signs up high and light them for visibility at night on all sides of buildings in uniform style
- Install large, clean signage in every *30-minute* parking lot
- Color code parking lots
- Identify the sidewalk between Lots 7 and 8 so that pedestrians can see and navigate better
- Improve *perimeter road* signage -- larger signs, more details on what's ahead or in a given direction/location
- Become more ADA conscious
- Install directional paths to all dorm buildings from a central point
- Design better *user-friendly* maps
 - Develop locator maps and place strategically throughout campus
 - Standardize maps for campus/community use and improve distribution
 - Develop a computerized/laid out map to be located in each parking lot or open areas convenient to visitors and students
 - Install outdoor mapping system and indoor signage (possibly on computers) with touch screen computer screens
- Equip staff with 8½ X 11 black & white maps of campus and red pen for marking directions
- Post maps at kiosks, magazine racks/large maps at bus stop, Capistrano, Riverside and Benicia halls
- Re-orient campus map for north at top perspective
- Install more *You are here* kiosks
- Improve parking signs on perimeter road
- Provide campus phones (info kiosks) that give directions

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Add information booths to east and west sides of campus • Use Dawn Cooper’s directional map idea for Lassen Hall: Large circle on the lobby floor with colored lines directing visitors to offices • Use mini-van with a big map/video tape to provide student tours. 	
<p>Technology</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhance CMS training program • Create a website standard for ABA, supporting accessibility • Update department websites • Increase info on website, to include a link to UTAPS (parking info) • Add interactivity to ABA website for problem-solving -- <i>Ask Herky</i> – with dropdown lists of common questions and links to departments that can help • Provide full internet access, e-mail • Computer maps • Provide internet access to police officers • Update website using student design classes 	<p>Actions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ABA began revision of division-wide web pages in December 2005. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Phase I was completed by the end of February 2006. ○ The revised ADA accessible website is consistent across ABA departments and units, providing information that is not only critical but helpful. ○ All pages include contact information, map locators, organizational and staff detail, department and unit functions, user-friendly forms, as well as information about the division’s Destination 2010 strategic plans and activities. ○ Further enhancements are planned through January 2007.
<p>Traffic/Transportation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promote a bike-friendly campus • Assist in traffic flow/surest alternate • Re-name roads • Moraga should be one-way in the opposite direction (south) • Provide arrows close to Information Booths directing visitors where to enter, so they don’t have to circle twice • Use a crossing guard at the Stadium and south Stop Sign (until a permanent solution is found) • Upgrade pathways for Facilities to navigate to work areas on campus. 	<p>Actions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A traffic light has been installed to replace the stop sign at Stadium Drive and University Drive South. It became operational fall 2006.
