<p>Communication</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase Public Safety presentations at neighboring schools • Walk around and talk to people • Communication is the lifeblood of productivity and (positive) attitudes. Disseminate more information to the general workers. Provide more communication classes for all staff and Facilities Management. • Do more advertising of campus activities / promote more community-related events through the media 	<p>Actions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Sac State Police Officer Sports Card program was initiated to encourage officers to walk around and talk to people. • The Campus Police opened up focus groups to all employees to encourage communication, participation, and feedback regarding key aspects of the department. • Officer Matthews gave a safety presentation at Saint Francis High School in the fall. • UPD increased staffing and training has taken place at the Student Residence Halls. This included presentations on personal and property safety, town-hall meetings, identification of narcotics, tour of University Police Department, increased/directed patrols and contact with residents internal/external, alcohol education and enforcement patrols. • UPD provided training to Facilities Services on new mandates for the National Incident Management System (NIMS)/Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS)/Incident Command System (ICS). More training is being scheduled for the entire Facilities Services Department. • UPD utilizes the Hornet Newspaper to print public safety alerts and crime prevention information.
<p>Community Outreach</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support groups that promote the campus with the larger Sacramento community and reimburse their costs • Sponsor more internships with outside companies 	<p>Actions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The campus Police Department is participating in various roundtables, task forces, and joint operations with other agencies to include the Sacramento.

- Give priority to local companies to do business on campus
- Encourage employees to join professional organizations and pay for membership fees
- Sponsor high-school and grade school tours
- Hold more open community events
- Host an *open house* to show what the campus is all about
- Host more free events to bring in the community
- Sponsor an Adopt a Building program to enhance community partnership with Police
- Allow officers and dispatchers to participate in joint training and task forces to build alliances
- Allow other agencies to train with us at our facilities
- Encourage officers and dispatchers to utilize Sacramento Police Department radio channel
- Keep the Olympic trials and other national/ international events on campus
- Work with local businesses to provide student discounts
- Encourage students to use local businesses that don't compete with or impact campus business
- Provide additional funding for Personal Money Management (for community use)
- Have more weekend events -- to utilize space and allow community members to attend events during their days off

- County District Attorney's Office, Alcohol Beverage Control, Sacramento County Sexual Assault Advisory Committee, Alcohol Awareness Program, Sacramento Robbery Investigators meetings, START, Property Board, and various other programs to build alliances with outside agencies and foster training/skills opportunities.
- The Police Department participated in a Safety Fair in September with Risk Management Services.
- The campus police investigator is joining California Crime Prevention Association.
- University Police Department held a barbeque for department members, families and students participating in the Community Service Officer Program.
- The Police Chief met with the deans of the different schools to determine what services are available through the police department and ascertain what additional services are needed.
- Investigations provided crime prevention seminars for three different buildings on campus.
- The Emergency Operation Center coordinator met with various Emergency Building Coordinators to discuss, recommend and assist with updating building plans.
- The University Police Department has worked collaboratively with the Sacramento Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriffs Department, and CHP for dignitary visits by the governor, foreign dignitaries, and local representatives.
- A University Police Department representative attends (regularly) the Greater Sacramento Hate Crimes Task Force at the Federal building.
- The University Police Department participated with local law enforcement agencies in a press conference combating alcohol abuse in concert with Alcohol Awareness coordinator (Sac State), and Sexual Assault Response Team (SART) meetings with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, and local mental health representatives.

Recognition

- Recognize employees who influence companies to provide financial or other support the campus

Actions

- Officer Thelma Matthews was recognized for her shooting abilities at the University Police Department quarterly firearms qualifications. She finished first as the most accurate marksman for the department.
- Officers were recognized by Residence Hall Life management for their continued dedication and efforts of working collaboratively in making the Residence Halls a safe place to live.
