



- Sacramento State's Emergency Notification System (ENS) informs the campus community in a variety of ways, including text messages, voice mail messages and e-mail messages about incidents that may be an immediate danger to faculty, staff, students and campus visitors.
- If you haven't signed up to receive text messages, **sign up now at [www.csus.edu/ENS](http://www.csus.edu/ENS)**.
- The alerts would only be used in the event of an emergency that threatened the campus community's health and safety, as well as provide protective action recommendations. Examples of such events would be a campus shooting, bomb threat, hazardous materials spills, flood or fire.

- **There's a new way to get in touch with faculty in their classrooms or at their desks when a critical incident occurs on campus—when a classroom or desk phone rings three times, pick it up!**
