Electronic Waste

Did you know that in 2007 only 18% of televisions and computer products that were discarded were offered for recycling? Additionally, in 2007 only about 10% of cell phones that were discarded were offered for recycling (EPA website – slide 3)

Are you sure you have e-waste?




- ① Many electronic devices can and should be given a second life elsewhere.
- ① On campus, we try to re-use as much as possible.

- ① Cell phones should have the SIM card removed and data manually deleted prior to offering for re-use.

- ④ Computer peripherals: cables, keyboards, printers, mice, speakers
- ④ Computer monitors
- ④ Copiers
- ④ Televisions/Radios
- ④ VCRs and DVD players
- ④ Microwave ovens
- ④ Telephones/Pagers
- ④ DVD's, CD's
- ④ Floppy discs
- ④ Cell phones
- ④ **Other?**

What is not recyclable as e-waste?

Batteries

-  Cadmium and lead are both hazardous materials.
-  Please DO NOT throw these in the trash!
-  Please call EH&S for battery disposal

Light Bulbs

-  Fluorescent lamps contain mercury
-  Please do not throw these in the trash!
-  Please call EH&S for fluorescent lamp disposal
