



CAMPUS PARKING CHANGES FOR FALL 2015

The new residence hall, Student Housing II, will be built on the site of Parking Lot 2, south of Desmond Hall and north of Shasta Hall, causing the campus to lose approximately 400 parking spaces during the two years of construction. Student Housing II is scheduled to open in Fall 2017.



What is the University doing to mitigate the loss of these parking spaces?

UTAPS (University Transportation and Parking Services) is making every effort to accommodate the campus community by providing alternative parking options, starting Fall 2015.

- The construction project will eliminate approximately 280 parking spaces for the residence halls. Students with a valid residence hall parking permit may park on the fourth floor of Parking Structure II.
- Approximately 250 student/daily parking spaces are available at the new Ramona Lot, on Ramona Avenue, near Power Inn Road and Cucamonga Avenue. The lot is open 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. A Community Service Officer (CSO) is on duty during that time.
 - Hornet Shuttles run to the Ramona Lot from the campus every 12-15 minutes weekdays. The first shuttle leaves the Ramona Lot at 7:40 a.m.; the last return shuttle leaves The WELL at 5:50 p.m. All vehicles must be removed by 6 p.m., when the lot is closed and locked. Ramona Line [Schedule](#) and [Route](#).
- Students may purchase semester parking permits for the Ramona Lot (not valid anywhere else on campus) for just \$84 at the UTAPS office in Folsom Hall. That's half the cost of a regular student semester parking permit.
- To accommodate Sac State employees who parked in Lot 2, a new staff lot is open next to Shasta Hall. The number of staff parking spaces isn't affected by the Student Housing II project.

What are my commute choices and how do I plan for the parking changes?

UTAPS encourages students, faculty and staff to arrive early and to avoid driving on the north end of campus, if possible. Ninety percent of the University's parking spaces are on the campus' south end.
