JUSTIFICATION:

For the Independent Doctorate: Students need to be prepared for their qualifying exams and they need to pass this exam in order to advance to the proposal writing stage. Learning to synthesize the content learned over the course of the program and applying that knowledge is critical and preparatory to the qualifying examination. The rationale for the course is two fold: 1) to prepare the students for their qualifying exams, and 2) to integrate proposal preparation into the coursework. The teams will work with each other in a format that builds upon prior knowledge and increases leadership potential.

This problem based seminar integrates the three themes of the program. The seminar includes conducting a review of the literature that will later be integrated into the candidates' proposal. In addition, each student will study and select theoretical frame/s that supports their doctoral topic. Students will also work in teams formed by research interests. They will present findings to classmates in forums that they facilitate and they will critique each other's work.



