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JUSTIFICATION:

DS 101, Data Analysis for Managers, should be a pr-requisite to OPM 101 because the students need to be exposed to forecasting, statistical process control, and spreadsheet applications before they take OPM 101. OPM 101 builds upon these topics, and having DS 101 as a prerequisite will improve the student performance and transition between the two courses. Another issue addressed by having DS 101 as a pre-requisite to OPM 101 is the problem that arises when students do not take DS 101 in a timely fashion, sometimes putting it off until their last one or two semesters before graduation. The Undergraduate Business Advising Center recommends that eligible students on the 4-year plan take DS 101 during the second semester of the sophomore year, and that OPM 101 be taken during the second semester of the junior year. For transfer students who have completed both STAT 1, Math 24, MIS 1, MIS 2, and MIS 3, the Undergraduate Business Advising Center recommends that DS 101 be taken in the first semester of the junior year. This prerequisite will therefore better prepare students for other courses taken in their senior year.



