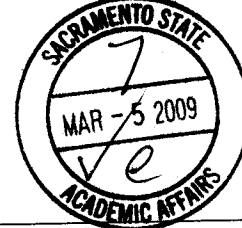

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JUSTIFICATION:

After careful review of the current core courses for the graduate program in Nursing, redundancies were found between Nurs 268 Policy and Health and Nurs 215 Community and Health. The content from Nurs 268 and Nurs 215 were combined into Nurs 215 and an additional unit was added to Nurs 215 to accommodate additional content. Included in the review of the core courses for the graduate program was an examination of the Essentials for Graduate Programs in Nursing mandated by the accrediting body of the American Association of Colleges of Nursing, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.
