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JUSTIFICATION:

The change in the course number is a part of an overall renumbering of all CrJ courses to create a more rational and understandable organization of course. The primary purpose for this Form A is to request that this course no longer be classified as writing intensive/advanced study. The Division currently teaches between seven and nine sections of our capstone course, CrJ 194, which is writing intensive. We cannot afford to offer this course as a writing intensive course under the current budget constraints. Thus we request that it be declassified as a writing intensive course but remain a GE course.



