Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification. The minimum number of units required in the professional course program will be reduced by 1 unit due to changing the number of units offered for PT 264 Neuropediatric Evaluation and Treatment from 3 to 2 units. The new program will require 77 units instead of 78 units. The other change involves providing an additional elective option to the PT 260 Graduate PT Seminar I course. We will offer a new course, PT 260A Graduate PT Seminar IA, for students who want to enhance learning opportunities through mentoring other students, and we will offer PT 260B as a replacement course number for PT 260. Students will have the option to take both PT260A and PT 260B, but will only be required to take one course to fulfill the Graduate Seminar I requirement. Fiscal Impact

The proposed changes will reduce the cost of PT264 by approximately \$6900. (reduction of 4 WTUs). No additional costs are involved in either adding PT260A or in changing PT260 to PT260B.

No fiscal impact on other academic units' programs.

Itemized changes:

1. Reduce the minimum number of required units for the Masters in Physical Therapy from 78 to 77 units.
2. PT 264 changes from 3 units to 2 units.
3. New course PT 260A is added to curriculum as option for fulfilling the first graduate seminar requirement
4. PT 260 changes to PT 260B and is now an option for fulfilling the first graduate seminar requirement
