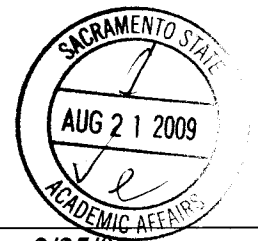

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**JUSTIFICATION:**

ASL 2 has long been classified as a lower-division course, and has been articulated with a number of junior IHEs as such. However, its current numbering has consistently created confusion about the status of this course. This renumbering is being done to eliminate this element of ambiguity.

Students will expand their communicative repertoire developed in EDS 52 to talk about people and places in a contextually-reduced framework. Through in-class discussions/demonstrations, course readings, and out-of-class field experience, students will be exposed to elements of the Deaf community and culture.


