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JUSTIFICATION:

There were a number of prerequisites erroneously assigned to this course; this change aims to correct this error in the course catalog. In addition, this course is being submitted for consideration as part of the General Education requirements. Further, this course is being renumbered as a lower division course, since it has been articulated with some area IHEs as such, and the renumbering here is aimed at removing ambiguities in the status of the course for students and faculty.

Course introduces students to topics central to the Deaf and Deaf community, including audiology, education, culture and history. Utilizing readings, lectures and group discussion, students will learn about the anatomy and causes of deafness, early intervention and education of deaf children, communication strategies and their effectiveness, the deaf as a cultural group and Deaf/Hearing relationships. Upon course completion, students will understand deaf individuals and their community in a holistic perspective and apply this knowledge toward their further studies into the Deaf culture and community.



