Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification.	
<p>The Department of Anthropology is proposing a re-categorization of various courses which come under some of the categories of required courses to complete the major. As itemized below, the faculty have voted to switch some courses OUT of the category 'Undistributed Electives' and INTO 'Distributed Electives' and vice-versa. In addition, some of the category sub-headings have been changed to reflect a different focus in the category.</p> <p>The proposed changes reflect the Department of Anthropology's response to two different issues:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) the transformations the field of anthropology has undergone: an increasing emphasis on thematic (rather than areal) focus; and,2) the need to create the space for students to take advantage of the new areas of expertise introduced by six new faculty members who joined the department over the past 4 years.

Proposed Changes:

1. REMOVE ANTH 164 from the Breadth Requirement and REPLACE WITH ANTH 162;

3. Change the number of units in category "Distributed Electives" to read "9 units;"
4. REPLACE subheading "Ethnographic" (under Distributed Electives) WITH Sociocultural/Linguistic;
5. Under the sociocultural/linguistic subheading (under Distributed Electives), REMOVE the following ANTH courses: 131, 134, 143, 144, 147, 148, 149 REPLACE WITH the following ANTH courses: 105, 108, 142, 160, 163, 164, 167 and ADD 168, 176, 187;
6. Under the "archaeological" subheading (under Distributed Electives), REMOVE the following ANTH courses: 115 & 116 REPLACE WITH 126 & 127;
7. Under the "physical" subheading (under Distributed Electives), REMOVE ANTH 158 and REPLACE WITH ANTH 156;
8. All of the courses REMOVED in itemized numbers 5, 6, & 7 (above) HAVE BEEN PLACED into the category titled "Undistributed Electives;" and, all of the courses which follow the phrase "REPLACE WITH" were originally in the "Undistributed Electives" category with the exception of ANTH 156 and ANTH 176 which are new courses added to the curriculum in 2005 and 2006, but not previously placed into catalog copy. In short: courses were switched with regard to which category they were placed; but no courses have been deleted.
9. Students may satisfy their PHYSICAL distributed elective requirement by taking ANTH 151 or 154 (listed under Breadth Requirements); however, students may not satisfy both breadth and distributed electives with the same (single) course.
