## ACTION ITEMS

\*AS 81-61B/Ex. GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

The Academic Senate approves the following resolution:

WHEREAS. In 1979-80, after a lengthy process of deliberation and debate, the faculty of CSU, Sacramento adopted a

new General Education Program, and

WHEREAS. In 1980, after a lengthy process of deliberation and debate, the Trustees of the CSUC adopted a new General Education Program which is embodied in Section 40405 of Title 5, and

WHEREAS. The CSU, Sacramento, General Education Committee has devoted great effort during the past year and a half "to meet the requirements of Title 5 while preserving as much as possible of the unique curricular content of the current CSU, Sacramento, General Education

Program", and

(OVER)

WHEREAS. In spite of the diligent efforts of the General Education Committee, an analysis of the most recent General Education Program proposal reveals substantial negative staffing, curricular, and fiscal implications, therefore be it.

RESOLVED. That the Academic Senate urge the President to request from appropriate members of the central administration a futher delay in meeting the requirements of Title 5. and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Academic Senate postpone final consideration of the General Education Program pending further study of staffing, curricular, and fiscal implications, and be it further

RESOLVED. That the Academic Senate direct the Executive Committee to oversee this study and ensure that it is completed by March 31, 1982.

# AS 81-61A/GE, Ex. GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

It was moved (Reinelt) and seconded to amend the proposed General Education program by adding a new section F. entitled World Civilization which would include 3 units each from section C. (Arts, Literature, Philosophy, Foreign Languages) and D. (Social Sciences).

Carried. HAND VOTE: YES - 16; NO - 7; ABSTENTIONS - 3

It was moved (Slaymaker) and seconded to amend the proposal to limit the entire General Education program, including all code requirements, to no more than 48 units.

Carried. HAND VOTE: YES - 16; NO - 9; ABSTENTIONS - 1

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m.
