Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification: Description:

The Art History faculty are proposing to replace the current two-course lower-division sequence in western art history (ART 1A: Stone Age to End of Middle Ages; ART 1B: Renaissance to Present) with a three-course sequence that makes it possible to address contemporary art at a global level (ART 1A: Stone Age to End of Middle Ages; ART 1B: Renaissance to Rococo; and ART 1C, Modern and Contemporary Art). The new course, ART 1C, will cover Rococo to Contemporary art. Furthermore, this three-course sequence will become part of the lower division foundation in the Art History concentration. To create a space for the new 3-unit course and retain the 48 unit structure, we will delete the upper division elective outside of the Art Department. The spirit of this requirement will be met instead through one of the three upper division General Education courses already required by the University. The new lower division course also will be incorporated in the Art History minor, where students will choose between ART 1A, 1B, and 1C: they will select any two of those courses in consultation with an Art History advisor.

Justifications:

- The current 2-semester foundation sequence in Western art history (ART 1A and 1B) is based on a standard created in the 1970s when modern and contemporary art history was shorter by four decades; in fact, the entire period now considered "contemporary" had not yet happened. For lack of time, ART 1B's coverage still ends in the 1960s-70s.
- 2) The ever-growing span of time covered by ART 1B alone has become impossible to cover without moving to a case study format in which the core idea of our discipline, that creative production is historically located, would be lost.
- 3) When the two-course foundation sequence was created at Sac State, important situations for living artists, such as the computer, new media and the pervasive globalization of culture, did not exist. These new and current contexts are not only relevant to the lives of our students, they have resulted in a major conceptual shift in the social roles of art that all Art students, as educated art professionals (artists, curators, teachers), must know.
- 4) Art history in the 1970s was Eurocentric, which is an inadequate cultural perspective for modern and contemporary art. After 1970 is also when women artists rose to approximately equivalent influence in the art world. ART 1C will present modern and contemporary art from multicultural world perspectives and will include more women artists.
- 5) Most regional community colleges offer a modern art history course as part of their 3course foundation. With just the 2-course ART 1A/1B sequence at Sac State, Art and Design majors transferring from community colleges only get partial or elective credit for Modern art history. The implementation of ART 1C will facilitate transfers.
- 6) Adding Art 1C with accommodating adjustments made to the curriculum will result in no fiscal impact on the department.
