4 Resolution in Opposition to Student Success Fees at California State Universities

- 5 WHEREAS: Since 2008 individual campuses in the CSU have introduced Student Success Fees, in
- 6 addition to regular tuition and other campus-based fees as a way of augmenting the state's general fund
- 7 support for institutional programs and other basic higher education needs, and
- 8 WHEREAS: About half of the campuses in the CSU have instituted such fees, which vary across
- 9 campuses and range from \$162 to \$630, equal to 3%-12% of tuition, and
- 10 WHEREAS: Traditionally, campus-based Category II fees have been used to cover incidental classroom
- 11 costs (e.g., laboratory fees) or to support activities not covered by state funding or regular tuition (e.g., a
- student union expansion or a child day-care center), but Student Success Fees are primarily intended to
- support basic classroom instruction, and
- 14 WHEREAS: The failure of the State of California to adequately support higher education has resulted in
- 15 fiscal pressures leading campuses to establish and increase Student Success Fees, but such Fees amount to
- a tax on students to receive the education they deserve, and
- 17 WHEREAS: In most cases, Student Success Fees are used to fund activities that state support
- 18 (supplemented by regular tuition) should be funding, such as faculty hiring, and therefore the Fees
- amount to de facto tuition hikes under a different name, and
- 20 WHEREAS: Questions have been raised about the consultation process by which students have been
- 21 asked to approve or disapprove such fee proposals, and there appears to be a lack of consistency across
- 22 campuses that leads to concerns about whether genuine student consultation has taken place, and
- 23 WHEREAS: Student Success Fees may run the risk of exacerbating differences in quality and
- opportunity among campuses as students on some campuses may be better able to support the increases
- 25 than others, and
- WHEREAS: Student Success Fees have been interpreted as an effort by the CSU to side-step the freeze
- on tuition increases that is part of the multi-year funding proposal for higher education proposed by the
- 28 governor, and the Chair of the Assembly Budget Subcommittee 2 (Education Finance) stressed that the
- 29 fees might undercut the Assembly's willingness to support budget augmentations requested by the CSU,
- 30 therefore be it
- 31 RESOLVED: That the Faculty Senate of the California State University, Sacramento (CSUS) oppose the
- 32 imposition of Student Success Fees at California State Universities, and be it further
- 33 RESOLVED: That the Faculty Senate express its appreciation that CSU, Sacramento has not sought to
- 34 initiate the process of considering imposition of Student Success Fees, and be it further
- 35 RESOLVED: That this resolution be distributed to President Gonzalez, the Academic Senate of the
- 36 California State University, campus senate chairs, the Board of Trustees of the California State
- 37 University, and the CSU Trustee Workgroup on Student Success Fees.
