The Faculty Senate further recommends Administrative consideration, in consultation with the local chapter of the California Faculty Association, of the meaning and application of Article 21.29 of the Faculty Contract which references "work spreading" of Academic Year appointments into the Summer, specifically for the Humboldt and Sacramento State campuses only, as this may have potential to alleviate problems associated with the faculty supervision of seasonal clinical placements.

The Faculty Senate further recommends Administrative consideration of the relatively expedient, partial assistance associated with the creation of additional capacity for SSP support to the program as outlined in the submission. (*Sheppard amendment*)
