Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification.

The Preliminary Mild/Moderate Education Specialist Credential Program will be reducing the number of units assigned to the Initial and Final Mild-Moderate Student teaching/internship field experiences and dropping five courses (EDS 101A/B, 130A/B, 291A/B, 273A/B, 276A/B) as a program Level 1 requirement. This action is in response to community feedback, student surveys, and as a reaction to mandated CCTC Standards for the Mild/Moderate Educational Specialist Credential. Additionally, in response to the above constituents and standards, the lecture/lab paradigm is being maintained for the majority of the methodology classes. Finally, in response to the above constituents, two new courses (EDS 229A/B and EDS 237A/B) will become part of the required coursework for the Mild/Moderate Educational Specialist Credential. These actions will lead to a net drop of nine-units of coursework and a reduction of six-units of fieldwork/student teaching/internship units (EDS 471 and 472/473). The proposed changes to the existing MM credential program are configured so that all CCTC standards are addressed in a more concise, compact and comprehensive set of courses, fieldwork, and seminar experiences. The reduction of units also addresses CCTC's recommendation to explore methods to streamline the process and requirements for earning an Education Specialist Credential. The unit reduction is also a cost-savings benefit to this graduate credential program. The Mild/Moderate and Multiple Subject Credential Pathway will include the revised Mild/Moderate course requirements while maintaining the currently approved structure for the Multiple Subject course requirements. Also, as recommended by the past-Chair of EDTE and supported by the current Chair, the "Identifier" of the following new courses are proposed to be EDS 332, EDS 420A, and EDS 420B to better reflect the department that houses the students and is responsible for the staffing of these experiences. The new final multiple subject student teaching course also reduces the units from 10 down to five-units.

In total, the newly proposed combined Mild/Moderate and Multiple Subject program is reduced from 80-86 units down to 62-64 units.
