Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification.
The Division of Social Work is proposing the elimination of the Social Work Minor. A significant component of social work education is the field education component. Preparation for field education requires course work preparation that is well beyond that which can be accomplished within the limits of course units for a minor area of study. Elimination of the social work minor supports the integrity of the social work major which prepares bachelor's level social work professionals who may practice in the community. There are currently 20 students classified as Social Work Minors. The Division will continue to advise and give priority registration to currently declared Minors until all have matriculated. In addition, eliminating the Social Work Minor will free up seats in required classes, needed by Social Work Majors to graduate in a timely manner. Social Work faculty resources currently allocated to advising and assessing Minors can be redirected to Social Work majors.
