







Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification.
1) Addition of a new Lower Division course WOMS 50: Intro to Gender & Sexuality as a Required Course for the Major and Minor in Women's Studies.
Justification: This new requirement is necessary for two main reasons: Currently Women's Studies does not offer any lower division courses. This will be our first lower division offering as part of the effort to make our curriculum more comprehensive. Secondly, Gender & Sexuality are integral sub-fields within Women's Studies. Currently, we do not offer any courses in these fields.
2) Changing the number of units required for the electives from 27 to 24 as 3 additional units have been added to the required courses for the major.
3) Addition of two courses to the list of Electives: WOMS 118: Asian American Women and HIST 175: Sex, Population & Birth Control in America.
Justification: WOMS 118 was approved as a new course in Fall 2009 and taught for the first time in Fall 2010. It has yet to be formally included to our list of electives. HIST 175 is a useful course addressing the control of reproduction in American history. It is a popular course among our majors. It will be a useful addition to our list of Electives especially given that our courses have been drastically cut due to budgetary constraints. Both courses will contribute to the accelerated graduation initiative. We have the permission of the Chair of the History Department to add this course as an elective.
