Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification.

The Photography Program in the Department of Design has reached a point where reorganization of the curriculum is required to codify quality elements of its long standing line of study while addressing budgetary realities and restrictions on facilities. Student demand for the Photography Program at Sacramento State has grown steadily over the last several years while resources diminish. Specifically the limited space in discipline specific facilities, aging equipment and lack of funding for an adequate number of full or part time faculty has created a series of barriers for students as they seek to graduate in a timely manner. The Photography faculty are seeking modifications that will allow students to efficiently move toward graduation while providing consistent quality instruction at all levels.

A summary of changes:

The Photography Program has officially applied for Impacted Status and is awaiting confirmation. The reorganization of the curriculum establishes a framework that will work with supplemental criteria that were submitted with the application for Impacted Status.

The Photography Program is lowering the total required units from 48 to 45.

The Photography Program is removing all required electives, which totals 3 courses.

The Photography Program is adding 1 course to its required courses from the required electives list.

The Photography Program is removing 2 courses from it current list of required courses.

The Photography Program is adding 3 new courses to its list of required courses.

The Photography Program is changing the course classification for all upper division studios from C4/C13 to C13. This brings Photography studio courses inline with time requirements established by its external accrediting body NASAD (National Association of Schools of Art and Design). This change also creates uniformity across all upper division studios in the Department of Design.

Form B Supporting Materials I - Programmatic or Fiscal Impact

The proposed changes will have little to no fiscal impact on other programs. The list of options for the required electives from the old program touched on 4 departments outside of design. The total number of photography majors coupled with the diversity of the offerings should not create a dramatic decline in enrollment for the courses effected. All programs effected were notified via email as to the pending changes. The notification emails are attached as separate documents.

Form B Supporting Materials II - Fiscal Analysis

The proposed changes, once established, will increase the total number of parttime WTUs required to operate the Photography program by 1.9 WTU's annualy. This is partially a result of changing the course classification for all upper division studios from C4/C13 combination to just C13. This will change the WTU expenditure for each upper division course from 3.6 to 3.9. This brings Photography studio courses inline with time requirements established by its external accrediting body NASAD (National Association of Schools of Art and Design). Please see the excerpt below from Page 71 of the NASAD 2011-2012 HandBook. This change also creates uniformity across all upper division studios in the Department of Design. The Dean of Arts & Letters has been consulted extensively and supports these changes.

"b. In lecture/discussion courses requiring outside preparation, one hour of credit represents one hour each week of the term in class, and two hours of work outside class. In studio/laboratory courses, one hour of credit represents three hours of studio/laboratory time and space each week of the term: normally, studio classes led by an instructor meet for a minimum of 1.5 hours per week for each credit granted, and more often than not, for two hours per week; the remaining time is for studio/laboratory class preparation. Any explanations and justifications regarding variations from these norms are to be substantiated with evidence of student achievement relevant to the purpose of the course. In all cases, faculty contact must be sufficient to ensure the development of knowledge and skills required by each course. Normally faculty contact is greater at the foundation or introductory level. "
