 - c. The effect of honors curriculum on underrepresented and underserved students.
 - Chemistry Department has a proposal for an honor's program which CPC members will review as background. Philosophy, Business, and GE also have Honor's programs.
 - CPC nominations for 2017-18 AY: Murphy nominated by Baldus, 2nd by Fell

and Amata for a second term as CPC Chair.

- Old Business:
 - Discussion of Supplemental Instruction policy (Murphy): Fell indicated CPC approved policy in Fall 2017 however it has not been reviewed by Exec Committee. Policy reviewed again by CPC and additional language added to reflect that supplemental courses will be initiated and supervised by academic units.
