Called to Order at 1:38 p.m.

I. Information Items:

a. Liaison reports:

- Kath Pinch had nothing to report from the Curriculum Subcommittee.
- Dan Melzer had nothing to report from the Writing and Reading Subcommittee.
- Ben Amata reported that the Program Review Oversight Committee (PROC) met on November 28 from 9-10:30 a.m. It will meet again next spring 2013. Updates on ongoing reviews were examined. They discussed current guidelines and the draft policy. The committee agreed that the current draft policy needs further revision.
- Ben Amata informed CPC that the Provost's Advisory Committee on Assessment (PACA) met on November 21 from 3-4 p.m. It will meet again on December 5. Provost Gossett addressed the committee. He recommended that the committee approach assessment with guiding principles: keeping it simple and looking for small incremental changes. The rest of the meeting focused on a general discussion of assessment and the IPP process.
- Chair Biagetti reported that the Council for Preparation of School Personnel (CPSP) will meet next Wednesday and consequently, she had nothing to report at this time.
- Ben Fell had nothing to report on the Diversity Awards Committee.

b. Faculty Senate and Senate Executive Update:

- i. Chair Biagetti reminded members that the proposal on Degree Program Minimum Unit Requirements (aligning with Title 5) will hopefully come before the Senate at this Thursday's Senate meeting. Although, it could easily be postponed to next spring. Chair Biagetti will attempt to move the proposal to a time certain (at today's Executive Committee meeting), since she does have a class that begins at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday and hopes to complete this at the Senate meeting before she leaves.

c. Graduate Dean Chevelle Newsome reported that they will be asking graduate programs for their assessment plans and learning outcomes, to hopefully help to streamline them.

d. Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies Sheree Meyer updated committee members on SB 1440 and similar degrees. Two responses were due last week. One from Anthropology and the other from Computer Science. She explained that this is the report asking if we can offer similar degrees in 60 units, including the incoming

transferring student's AA degree. Anthropology was approved and Computer Science responded negatively. Computer Science has been asked to revisit their response.

II. Action Items:

- Vice Chair Amata reported that the Course Activation Proposal and the guiding principles that accompany the proposal were discussed at the Senate meeting as first and second reading items and they passed.

  - vi. Once Dr. Wang has approved the survey, then Chair Biagetti will forward the survey on to Human Subjects for final clearance.
- b. Old Business: Service Learning Designation – was not addressed at the meeting, however, it will be reviewed at a future meeting.
