The lecture, titled "The Trans-Pacific Partnership and U.S. Relations with East Asia and the Pacific," will be from 3 to 4 p.m. Monday, March 28, in The WELL's Terrace Suite.

Sac State to host climate change conference April 10-11

"Water and Fire: Impacts of Climate Change" is a free, invitation-only conference convened at Sacramento State on April 10-11 that will connect science, policy, and local climate change. On Day 1, three internationally recognized scientists will debate 40 representatives from academia, science, industry, advocacy, and government about water, wildfire, and fish policies in light of changing climate. On Day 2, audience members and debaters will gather in moderated caucuses to identify areas of consensus and actionable next steps. Conference conclusions will be published.

Convened by the Institute on Science for Global Policy (www.scienceforglobalpolicy.org) in partnership with Sacramento State faculty and students, the conference does not lobby for any position. Attendance is required on both days. Security tip: Choose SaclinkSecure for campus wireless

When connecting your laptops, smart phones, tablets, or other devices to the campus network, you may see multiple networks available. Always select SaclinkSecure to maximize your network speed, mobile coverage, and security.

While most devices support the fast and secure protocols of SaclinkSecure, some older devices may not. If your device does not, try connecting to Saclink. But keep in mind that your network connection with Saclink alone is not secure unless the site you are visiting itself secures your connection. A secure connection is indicated by "https" at the beginning of the URL and a locked icon on your browser. Saclink is still supported on campus to address legacy technology that is not supported by the preferred SaclinkSecure technology.
