Eduroam will become the official campus Wi-Fi by December

By December, SacLink Secure will be replaced with a new official Wi-Fi connection, eduroam. Eduroam (education roaming) is a secure, worldwide roaming access service developed for the international research and education community. Several other CSU and UC campuses already are part of the eduroam network because of its flexibility, ease of use, and security. When you join the eduroam network, you'll automatically have Wi-Fi access on campus and when you travel to other eduroam hotspots, without data or roaming charges.

Call for proposals: Faculty Scholarship (and Peer Review) Communities

The Office of Research Affairs invites faculty proposals for a pilot series of cross-disciplinary Faculty Scholarship (and Peer Review) Communities (FSCs). This initiative is designed to support faculty who are conducting research and scholarly activity by providing venues where faculty can come together across disciplines to engage with a shared topic, interest, or pursuit, and to offer peer review and advising on research projects. Each proposed FSC must identify a lead faculty moderator (or a team of two co-moderators) responsible for composing a syllabus of shared readings, setting meeting dates and times, leading discussions, and organizing member activities. Each moderator will receive \$1,000 in faculty research support funds (shared if a co-moderator) at the conclusion of the FSC.
