Call for proposals: Faculty Scholarship (and Peer Review) Communities

The Office of Research Affairs invites faculty proposals for a pilot series of cross-disciplinary Faculty Scholarship (and Peer Review) Communities (FSCs). This initiative is designed to support faculty who are conducting research and scholarly activity by providing venues where faculty can come together across disciplines to engage with a shared topic, interest, or pursuit, and to offer peer review and advising on research projects. Each proposed FSC must identify a lead faculty moderator (or a team of two co-moderators) responsible for composing a syllabus of shared readings, setting meeting dates and times, leading discussions, and organizing member activities. Each moderator will receive \$1,000 in faculty research support funds (shared if a co-moderator) at the conclusion of the FSC.

Emergency Notification System test scheduled for June 23

Campus officials will conduct an Emergency Notification System (ENS) test at 11:15 a.m. Friday, June 23, to confirm the reliability of the ENS text function, which experienced reported delays during the May 12 system test. The upcoming ENS test will include text messages, emails, phone calls, campus digital signs, the University home page, and desktop alerts on some University-owned computers, as well as social networks such as Facebook and Twitter.

Students, who already are signed up to receive ENS messages on their cellphones and via email, should use this test to confirm that their devices are registered correctly. Faculty and staff must register for ENS messages at csus.edu/ens/signup if they have not done so previously. No survey will accompany this test; however, questions or concerns regarding the test can be directed to Ken Barnett at barnettk@skymail.csus.edu.

Summer Conflict Resolution workshop to begin June 19

The Center for African Peace and Conflict Resolution will present the 21st Summer Conflict Resolution workshop from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. June 19-23. The training workshop aims to build conflict-resolution skills in negotiation and mediation, as well as to provide fundamental knowledge of conflict theory and analysis. The training will be led by Ernest Uwazie, professor of criminal justice and director of the Center for African Peace and Conflict Resolution; and attorney Daniel Yamshon, a renowned mediator/arbitrator and conflict resolution trainer. The summer workshop is organized in cooperation with the California Lawyers for the Arts/Sacramento Mediation Center and the Sacramento County Bar Association-ADR Section.
