**ADA Transition Plan and Self-Evaluation complete**

Sacramento State is pleased to announce the completion of its Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan and Self-Evaluation, as mandated by the ADA. The transition plan is an analysis of the University's built environment. It identifies and inventories physical obstacles that limit accessibility, prioritizes methods to be used to make facilities accessible, and develops phasing plans for implementation. The self-evaluation is an analysis of all programs, services, and activities that identifies barriers to access and recommends policy changes to ensure appropriate inclusion exists.

Both documents can be reviewed at [csus.edu/counsel/ada](http://csus.edu/counsel/ada). As part of these projects, the University held multiple open forums to gather input from students, faculty, staff, and community members on a variety of topics including, but not limited to, accessible instructional materials and websites, housing and transportation, and campus activities, with the goal of improving access to education for those with disabilities.

The University will be hiring an ADA coordinator to oversee the transition plan and the self-evaluation implementation work plan as part of the position's broader coordination of compliance with the ADA and efforts to enhance inclusiveness and accessibility for individuals with disabilities.
