As part of Hispanic Heritage Month, the Serna Center Speaker Series presents Dr. Tara J. Yosso, speaking on "Reclaiming Our Histories: Recovering Community Cultural Wealth," at 3 p.m. Friday, Sept. 16, in the University Union, Hinde Auditorium. Dr. Yosso is a professor in the School of Education at the University of Michigan. Her research and teaching apply the frameworks of critical race theory and critical media literacy to examine educational access and equity, emphasizing the community cultural wealth that students of color bring to school. Her article, "Whose Culture Has Capital? A Critical Race Theory Discussion of Community Cultural Wealth," has become the top cited article in *Race Ethnicity and Education*. Professor Emeritus Steve Gray inducted into USA Rugby Hall of Fame

Professor Emeritus Steve Gray (Recreation, Parks, and Tourism) was inducted into the USA Rugby Hall of Fame this summer in Philadelphia. Gray played for and was captain of both the national 15-a-side and 7-a-side rugby teams during the 1970s and 1980s. He also was selected to an international all-star rugby team that toured Wales and played the Welsh national team for its centenary season in 1981. Additionally, he coached the national rugby 7's team and coached collegiate teams at UCLA, San Diego State, UC Davis, and Sacramento State. His 1987 San Diego State team won the national championship.

Security tip: Misdirected emails

What do you do if you receive a confidential email – for example, from a law firm addressed to the “General Counsel” with attachments – and you believe you have received this email by mistake, and that it contains protected information you are not authorized to possess? You must delete the misdirected email, along with its attachments. Do not read, forward, copy, or otherwise access the email attachments. If you are unsure whether information is protected, review the CSU’s policy or contact the Information Security Office. Never ask co-workers whether a document is protected because you may be further inappropriately circulating protected information. For more information, contact the Information Security Office.
