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Spanish 110. Survey of Spanish Literature to 1800. Advanced readings, lectures, and discussions dealing with a panoramic view of Spanish literature from early works through the Golden Age and up to the 1800s. PREREQUISITE: SPAN 100. Units 3.0.

Course Description. A general study of Spanish literature from early works to the 1800s.. As a survey course, we will examine a series of representative literary movements and schools. Students will be reading a diversity of authors and genres in the textbook, *Voces de España*. Each work will be studied and analyzed in class. Students will become familiar with the historical context, authors biography, culture and style. Students also will have the opportunity to develop critical thinking skills. Students are expected to read in advance the works presented in class and be prepared to answer questions. Students also will be asked to do some additional research of the authors, the culture of the times, and the history. Two films from this literary period will be presented in class.
