Invited sessions are being solicited for the Western Family Economics Association (formerly the Western Region Home Management-Family Economics Educators) annual conference in Tucson, Arizona, January 24-27, 2007.

You are invited to submit an invited session based on research or scholarship with respect to any facet of family economics history, anthropology, sociology, economics, education, child or family studies, demography, theory, concepts, practical application, literature review, program development and/or evaluation. Acceptance will be based on the session's contribution to the field of family economics (which includes the economic functioning of families institutionally, managerially and financially, and the economics of families in relation to their social, economic and political environment) and the recommendations of a minimum of two reviewers with the emphasis on the importance, quality and accuracy of the work. No invited session can be accepted unless the author or willing colleague will present it at the conference. Every presenting author is expected to pay full registration fees.

Guidelines and Time Table

September 29, 2006 (Extended to October 6, 2006) -- Paper electronically submitted to the Conference Program Chair.

November 6, 2006 -- Review completed and decision sent to authors.

Electronic submissions using an email attachment in WORD are required. The style guidelines in the publication manual of the American Psychological Association (5th Edition) are required. Be sure to include a separate title page including title, author(s), institution, and lead author's address, e-mail, and telephone number. Include an abstract at the beginning of the paper that does not exceed 175 words. The paper should be of a length that could be presented in a 20-minute time frame (i.e., a maximum of 25 double-spaced pages including all tables, bibliographic materials, etc.).
