Include **clear transitions** to place the exchanges you highlight within the overall sequence of the conversation, mentioning at least **two non-verbal details** you observed--gestures, facial expressions, posture, etc. As with your observation report, provide as much detail as possible in (b) & (d), but in (a), (c) & (e) focus on details most relevant to the key exchanges. (**ADD (f) & (g) if your wish to highlight a third exchange. **)

FINALLY, please note in your account TWO CONNECTIONS between your conversation & site visit.
