Poster Presentation – Dates on Topic Assignment

Format of the Poster Presentation:

- You will bring a poster to class on your poster session day. Before the poster session, you will have 2 minutes to tell the class the high points of your project
- The poster session will occur in **two installments**. First, half the presenters will stand next to their posters. They will give a **10-minute talk** about their subject to the people who choose to visit that poster. Then they will answer **questions for 5 minutes**.
- After the first presenters have finished, the second half will stand by their posters and give their 10-minute talk, followed by 5 minutes of questions.
- During the poster session, each class member will choose **two posters** to visit, one in each half of the poster session. For **each** of those posters, the class member will write a **one-paragraph summary (a total of two summaries)**. **Presenters** will choose **one** poster presentation to visit and summarize during the part of the poster session when they are not presenting.
- You will also email me your Powerpoint for grading.

Planning your poster and presentation:

- Your poster will be a single Powerpoint slide printed on the large format printer at the Student Technology Center (AIRC 3007). Here are STC's policies on poster printing:
 - One poster per student per semester; Must be an enrolled Sac State Student and have an assignment, syllabus, or note from professor.
 - **Posters require 3 days lead time for printing**. For our Thursday poster sessions, you must submit your poster NO LATER than noon on MONDAY to pick it up at 10 am (when STC opens) on THURSDAY. If you cannot pick the poster up on Thursday, then you must submit to STC no later than noon the previousThursday for pickup on WEDNESDAY.
 - I have provided a 36" X 48" Powerpoint template for you to use.
 - Poster has at least .5 in margins to avoid bleeding off the edge
 - Use a WHITE background; keep images reasonably sized.
 - For clear images make sure pictures are 300dpi or larger
 - Bring the electronic file of your poster on a flash drive, saved as your SacLink Username (For example, "yourusername.ai").
- If you do not know how to use Powerpoint to make a poster, STC offers workshops.
- Plan no more than 10 minutes of talk.
- You do not need to teach a lot of background about your topic. Focus on the guiding questions for your topic.
- Remember that the same rules of plagiarism apply to presentations as well as to papers.
 DO NOT cut and paste any text from anywhere into your presentation.
- All images should be credited in your presentation. Just put a text box somewhere on the page with the URL where you found the image.
- Include a reference list.
- Be sure to **look at the Poster Presentation Rubric** while you are planning your talk. I will use the rubric in assigning a grade.
