My experience in Economics of Education was much different than any I have had in any other Washington University classroom. Professor Lang brought energy and a keen sense of the material into the classroom and from the beginning of the course to the very end showed his knowledge and eagerness to help us learn.

David Lang's teaching style helped to take a subject that is not so easy to understand, and put the information in simple terms that everyone could understand. The way he conducted class was very suitable to the student, with class participation very much encouraged throughout the semester. He was always quick to help with difficult reading assignments and when things would become confusing for the students.

The Economics of Education class was a very interesting introduction into how economics play such a large role in education around this country. We tackled subjects such as cost of going to school, the differences between public and private schooling, and many others. The course packet that Professor Lang put together was informative, yet not too heavy on one subject. It covered many different aspects of economics of education, allowing the students to get a diverse education on the topic.

Overall, Professors Lang's teaching style enabled the students a healthy learning environment, while also giving us a tremendous introduction to the economics of education. It was a pleasure to be in his class, an experience that taught me how to properly dissect and obtain the important facts in a article and also about how important economic decisions are to one's education.
