Background Graphics...

- can be loaded by using either *Import Background* or *Add Clip Art* from the
 File menu
- are pasted onto the card itself (the 'background')
- can be selected and modified (e.g., erased, drawn upon) using Paint Tools
- can be flipped, scaled and rotated (using Flip Sideways, Flip Upside Down, or Scale & Rotate from the Effects submenu under the Edit menu)

Graphic Objects...

- o are created by using **Add a Graphic Object** from the **Objects** menu
- float above the background surface of the card (as do buttons and text objects)
- cannot be selected or modified by the Paint Tools
- cannot be flipped, scaled or rotated

Import Background vs. Add Clip Art

- Graphics created using Import Background . . .
 - paste the entire graphic on the card
 - are painted onto the background of the card, but floating objects [i.e., buttons, text and graphic objects] aren't affected
 - can be re-sized to fit the size of the card (but this may distort the images)
 - change the color palette to better match the colors in some images (which is more important in 256 colors than in thousands or millions)

Graphics created using Add Clip Art . . .

- can cover all or part of the card
- can be a rectangular or oval portion of the graphic selected using the rectangle or oval selection tools
- can be an irregular shape selected using the lasso tool
- can be moved, flipped, scaled and rotated while the selection is still floating above the background (*i.e.*, before you click outside the selection)
- may have the color changed (because colors are changed to the closest colors found in the normal color palette)

To Add a Graphic using Import Background...

- Select *Import Background* from the **File** menu
- If the picture is not the same size as the card, a dialog box will appear asking if you want to re-size the graphic. Try re-sizing if you think it's appropriate. If it doesn't work out the way you want, just import the background again.

To Add a Graphic using Add Clip Art...

- Select Add Clip Art from the File menu
- Select a portion of the graphic using either the selection rectangle or the lasso
 - select the entire graphic by double-clicking on the selection rectangle
 - select all of the image except the background color by double-clicking on the lasso
- Click on the **OK** button
- Move (and rotate, flip or scale the object) and then click outside the selected graphic to paste it onto the background

Special notes about using the **lasso** tool:

- the lasso outlines an image on a solid-colored background, shrinks around the image, and leaves the background color transparent
- items captured by the lasso cannot be flipped or rotated

To Add a Graphic Object ...

- There are two ways to add a graphic object
 - select an object on a card by using the selection rectangle or lasso, next choose *Add a Graphic Object* from the **Objects** menu, and then click on Yes when the dialog box pops up
 - select Add a Graphic Object from the Objects menu, select the source for your graphic, and then select the graphic using the selection rectangle or lasso as described above.
