Nammour Symposium – Spring 2017
Call for papers

This year's Nammour Symposium will include an essay contest posters and presentations session on the afternoon of Wednesday, April 5th, from 1:00 to 3:30 p.m. Paper submissions on any topic related to immigration are welcome.

The papers can be submitted in the following categories:

- (A) A short ethics (broadly defined) paper of 2000 words or less
- (B) A long ethics (broadly defined) paper of 4000 words or less
- (C) A short non-ethics paper of 2000 words or less
- (D) A long non-ethics paper of 4000 words or less

Examples of ethics topics (other related topics are welcome):

- Open or closed borders
- Rights and/or responsibilities of refugees and other migrants
- Distinction between political and economic migrants
- Social or distributive justice

Examples of non-ethics topics (other related topics are welcome):

- Culture and ethnicity
- Identity
- The self (e.g., social or ecological accounts of the self)
- Human nature

Please prepare your submissions for blind review (no name on the paper). Review of submissions will commence on Tuesday, March 14th. Late submissions are not guaranteed consideration. You can send the ethics papers to choe-smith@csus.edu and the non-ethics papers to ayala@csus.edu. The subject line for your submission should include "Nammour Symposium Paper Submission" and identify one of the above categories (e.g., "B"). We will notify the qualifying winners on or about Wednesday, March 22nd. The winners will be asked to prepare a poster to be displayed at the symposium (required). The winners also will be invited to give a brief presentation of their work during the session (optional). The participating winners will receive a gift certificate.
