Dear Student:

Thank you for your interest and participation in Sacramento State. The University is facing deep cuts in state funding, and the campus has been forced to make some very difficult decisions. As a result, we are implementing changes to the Sixty Plus program.

If you are an eligible Sixty Plus student who has already been accepted into a degree-seeking program, or if you are a continuing student seeking a second bachelor's degree, you will remain eligible for the Sixty Plus fee waiver (\$3-per-semester rate).

Unfortunately, budget cuts from the state have made it impossible for us to continue offering Sixty Plus services to other students, including unclassified graduate students, those not accepted to a degree-seeking program, new students seeking second bachelor's degrees and class auditors. Students must be making progress toward their degree in order to continue and remain eligible the Sixty Plus fee waiver program.

Beginning this fall, the following guidelines also will apply:

- Applicants for the waiver must follow all University application guidelines and meet all admission requirements.
- New students ages 60 and up will be eligible for the Sixty Plus fee waiver if they have been admitted under University admissions policies.
- All Sixty Plus program advising will be available through the Office of Academic Advising, the University Catalog and academic departments under the same guidelines as all students.
- Availability of classroom space will continue to be a criterion for the granting of Sixty Plus fee waivers.

The campus is making these changes in light of the state's unprecedented budget crisis. Many of the enrollment restrictions also are being imposed on students who are not seeking the Sixty Plus fee waiver, including those who would pay full fees.

I apologize for any inconvenience these changes cause. However, even our most cherished programs must succumb to the realities of state funding cuts. Thank you again for your interest in Sacramento State.
