In compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act and the Campus Fire Safety Right-To-Know Act, Sacramento State has made statistics and information available online at <http://www.csus.edu/police/cleryact.htm>. The Sacramento State Police Department collects crime statistics from local and appropriate police agencies, gathers information from multiple sources both on campus and off campus, and prepares the report. Crimes reported on campus, in certain off campus buildings, or property owned or controlled by Sacramento State and on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus during the last three years are included. The report includes fire safety statistics and information, institutional policies concerning campus security, alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, sexual assault and other safety matters. During the fall semester of every year, information is emailed to all enrolled and prospective students, faculty and staff. In addition, all CSU employees receive a notice concerning this information on their August paycheck. Print copies are available in the University Library, Police Service Center located in the University Union and by request from the Office of Public Safety and the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs.
