
Executive Summary for the 2013-2014 Annual Assessment Reports California State University, Sacramento



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Q1. Program Learning Outcomes

In the 2013-2014 academic year, our academic programs assessed the following learning outcomes (See Table I for more details). The top five learning outcomes assessed included: 1) critical thinking (critical thinking, inquiry and analysis, problem solving, and creative thinking), 2) written communication, 3) overall competencies in the discipline, 4) integrative and applied learning, and 5) oral communication skills. These program learning outcomes aligned directly with the institutional learning outcomes and with the missions of the university and accreditation agencies.

Q3. Methods and Measures

Almost 90% of our programs conducted assessment by collecting and evaluating the data. See Table 6 for more details.

We used various measures to assess student learning outcomes, including direct, indirect, and other measures. The majority of the direct assessment came from capstone projects and/or key assignments from other core classes. See Tables 7 and 8 for more details.

Many programs also used various indirect measures, including student surveys (conducted by the university, the colleges, and/or the departments), focus group interviews, or alumni surveys. See Tables 9 and 8 for more details.

Some programs also used other measures including national disciplinary exams or state/professional licensure exams and general knowledge and skills measures (e.g., CLA, CAAP, ETS PP, etc.) See Table 10 for more details.
