# CAMPUS CLIMATE SURVEY REPORT FALL 2016





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#### The 2016 Campus Climate Survey for Students

Summary

#### **Campus Climate Survey Methodology**

In fall of 2016 the Office of Institutional Research administered the Campus Climate Survey for Students in partnership with the Campus Educational Equity Committee (CEEC) to a random subset of students. Survey efforts included gathering information about the campus climate at Sacramento State, particularly with respect to intergroup dialogue regarding issues of diversity. In the scope of this survey, campus climate refers to "the formal and informal environment in which we learn, teach, work, and live in a post-secondary setting."

This survey was administered to approximately 33% of the student population within each class level (stratified random sampling). The new undergraduate students who entered in fall 2016 were excluded due to their limited experience on campus and have received a different survey in September. Subsequently, **8,760** students were invited to participate in the survey that was administered from October 3<sup>rd</sup> to November 11<sup>th</sup>. From the **8,760** that were distributed the survey, **991** of those students participated for an overall response rate of **11%**.

When reviewing the background information, **66%** of respondents were in the 16-24 age group. Most of the respondents were seniors (**42%**) and female (**68%** vs. **32%**). Additionally, the Hispanic/Latino participants increased by **6.5%** from the previous survey administration in 2013 (**26%**) and the proportion of Caucasian respondents decreased by **5%** from 2013 to 2016.

### Notable Changes During 9-year and 3-year Period

#### **Classroom Experiences**

- Compared to 2007 and 2013 survey results, students reported a decline in frequency to raise global/international issues for class discussion by **7%** (35% or 34% vs. 27%).
- When asked "in your classes, how comfortable do you feel discussing and debating issues" related to age, disabilities, foreign nationality, gender, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation and spiritual/religious beliefs, the comfort level had declined from the previous surveys administered in 2007 and 2013. The top three issues with highest decrease of comfort level were religion, age and gender (dropped 10% 12%).

#### Critical Issues

- Over a nine year period (2007 to 2016), students believed more emphasis had been placed on "promoting a sense of community on campus" (22% increase), "promoting an appreciation for a multicultural society on campus" and "promoting an international community on campus (both up 18%) and "promoting a campus climate where differences of opinion are regularly aired openly" (13% increase).
- Although many students believed that the campus has placed high or considerable emphasis on the areas above, they indicated that more emphasis should be placed on "promoting an appreciation for a multicultural society on campus" and "promoting an international community on campus" with 7% and 6% increases, respectively, compared to 2007 survey results.

#### Structured Dialogue

- When asked "how frequently do you have opportunities for structured dialogue (e.g. workshops, training, seminars, etc.) within the university" about issues related to diversity, all areas but religion showed notable increases, ranging from 6% to 20% over the 9-year period.
- When asked the same question of structured dialogue within "major", the response for all areas but age decreased notably, ranging from 7% to 14% over the 9-year period.
- There were no notable changes in terms of structured dialogue during the 3-year period.

### Personal Experiences

- The survey did not find any notable changes during either the 3-year period or the 9-year period, in terms of "have personally been harassed or discriminated against on campus based on the following attributes, such as age, disability, gender, ethnicity, etc." The percent experiencing harassment have remained very low (the median of 9 areas was below 5%).
- A few students reported witnessing others being harassed on campus (the median of 9 areas was 13% in the 2016 survey), however, the incidence of hearing disparaging comments, behaviors, or gestures toward others, in terms of political viewpoints, has increased notably between 2013 and 2016 (6% increase) and between 2007 and 2016 (5% increase).
- In terms of diversity, more students strongly agreed or agreed on 4 positive changes on campus (median of 4 statements = 62%) with 11% increase from 2007 to 2016.

#### Interaction and Involvement

- When asked "to what degree do you have an interest" in the 7 issues of diversity, more students expressed their interest compared to responses 9 years ago (5-11% increase). More students expressed higher interests in the issues related to disability, gender and race, compared to the responses 3 years ago (5-7% increase).
- When asked "how comfortable are you interacting with faculty, staff and students who are different from you" on the basis of age, gender, ethnicity, etc. **79%** (median of 7 areas) of respondents stated that they felt highly or considerable comfortable.
- Only 3% percent of students reported a negative experience that prevented them from interacting among different race/ethnic groups in 2016 (the median of 3 questions =3%).

#### Conclusion

When comparing survey results from the 2007 and 2013 administrations of the Campus Climate Survey with findings from the 2016 survey, they were notably different with positive changes in following areas: focuses on diversity issues, structured dialogue, personal experiences and interaction among different groups over the 9-year period. However, the comfort level of discussing the diversity issues in classroom or within major\programs showed negative changes over 9-year period as well as between 2013 and 2016.

In general, the changes during 9-year period are more notable in more areas than the changes during 3-year period, which indicates that climate change is a long and slow evolving process on campus.
