Tutoring and Mentoring

Tutoring and mentoring opportunities for students are available through these programs:

Academic Affairs:

- First Year Experience Program (FYE) -- Peer tutoring and mentoring is organized by matching students who have completed an FYE course with faculty teaching First Year Experience Seminars (to serve as their peer mentors)
- College of Natural Science and Mathematics: The Peer Assisted Learning Program
 provides peer-based tutoring for students in STEM courses
- College of Health and Human Services: <u>The Division of Criminal Justice</u> has a tutoring program for high school students

- CAMP program

Peer Mentor Network:

To expand the impact that peer mentors have at CSUS, a significant component of the Hispanic Serving Institution Designation is the creation and institutionalization of a collaborative among all programs that support peer mentors of all type on campus. The collaborative works together to identify best practices and share them as its members work to locate students who would benefit from having peers help them to be more successful on campus. The overall goal is to give students an opportunity to learn from one another. A key goal of this initiative is to

extend the number peer mentors throughout campus, and includes the establishment of an endowment to be used solely for supporting peer mentors on campus.
