### Fall 2024 SI Data

#### Population Served:

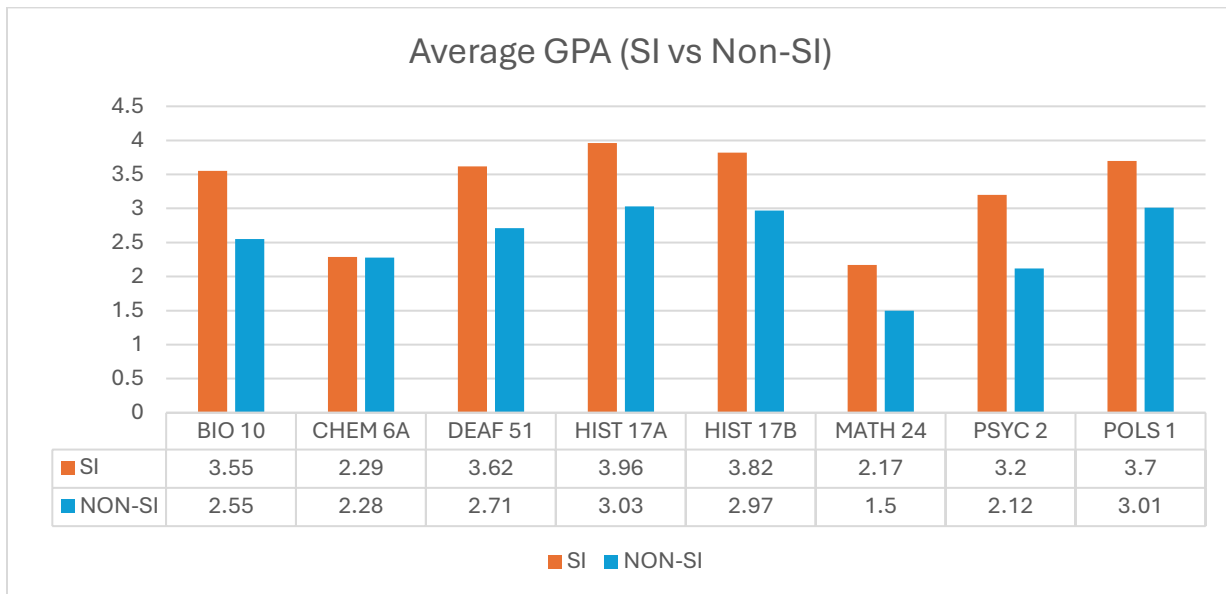
- ❖ The PARC offered SI to 83 formally enrolled students in 14 SI courses. These numbers do not account for students who participated in SI by attending informally.
- ❖ All sections were associated with an upper or lower division course.

#### General Data:

- ❖ 89% of SI students received a passing grade in the associated course.
- ❖ Of the non-SI students, 77% received a passing grade.
- ❖ On average, SI students earned .77 GPA points higher than non-SI students.

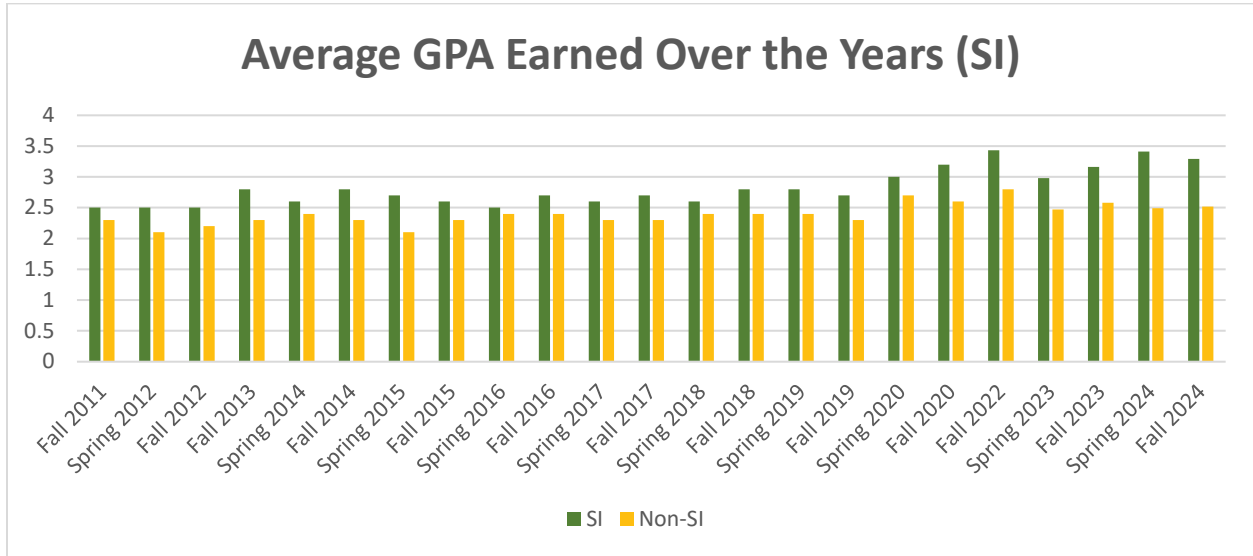
### Average GPA

On average, SI students performed better than their classmates who did not enroll in SI. In addition, SI students earned an average 3.29 GPA while non-SI students earned an average 2.52 GPA. Therefore, students in SI earned an average .77 GPA points higher than their peers not enrolled in SI.



### Average GPA over the years

The graph below tracks the overall averages of GPA comparisons (between students taking SI to those who did not receive SI support) from semester to semester.

### Spring 2025 SI Data

#### Population Served:

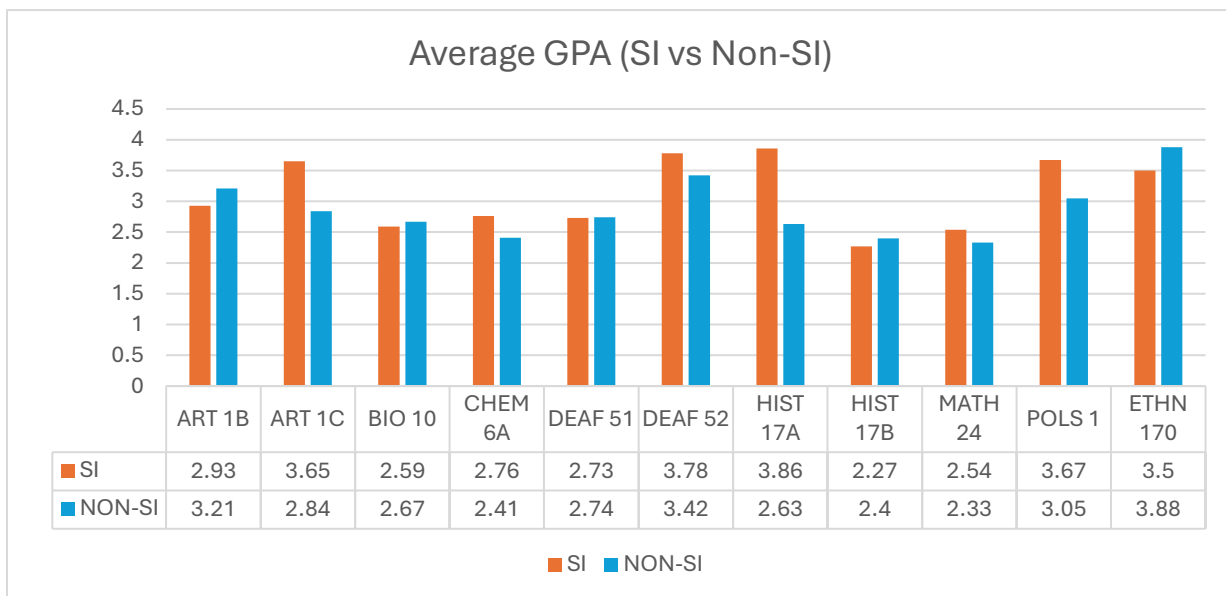
- ❖ The PARC offered SI to 116 students in 17 SI courses. Additionally, 77 students participated in SI by attending informally (not enrolled). Note: *only formally enrolled students are accounted for in the GPA comparison.*
- ❖ All sections were associated with an upper or lower division course.

#### General Data:

- ❖ 87% of SI students received a passing grade in the associated course.
- ❖ Of the non-SI students, 78.95% received a passing grade.
- ❖ On average, SI students earned .25 GPA points higher than non-SI students.

### Average GPA

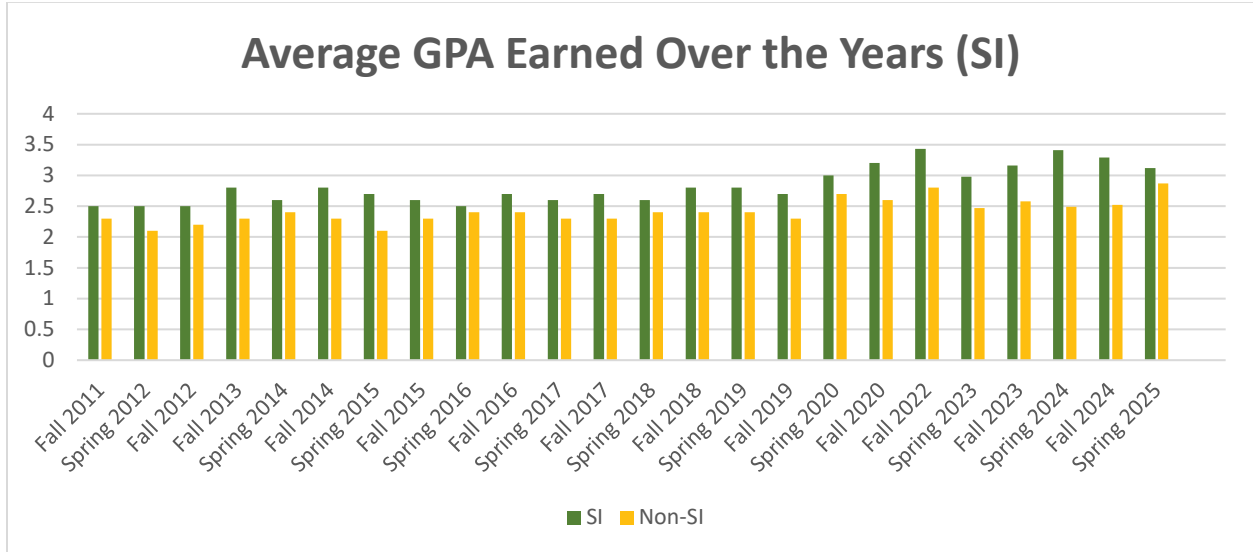
On average, SI students performed better than their classmates who did not enroll in SI. In addition, SI students earned an average 3.12 GPA while non-SI students earned an average 2.87 GPA. Therefore, students in SI earned an average .25 GPA points higher than their peers not enrolled in SI.



Note: GPA comparisons include only students formally enrolled in SI. Students who participated informally were categorized as non-SI participants, which may have skewed the data.

### Average GPA over the years

The graph below tracks the overall averages of GPA comparisons (between students taking SI to those who did not receive SI support) from semester to semester.

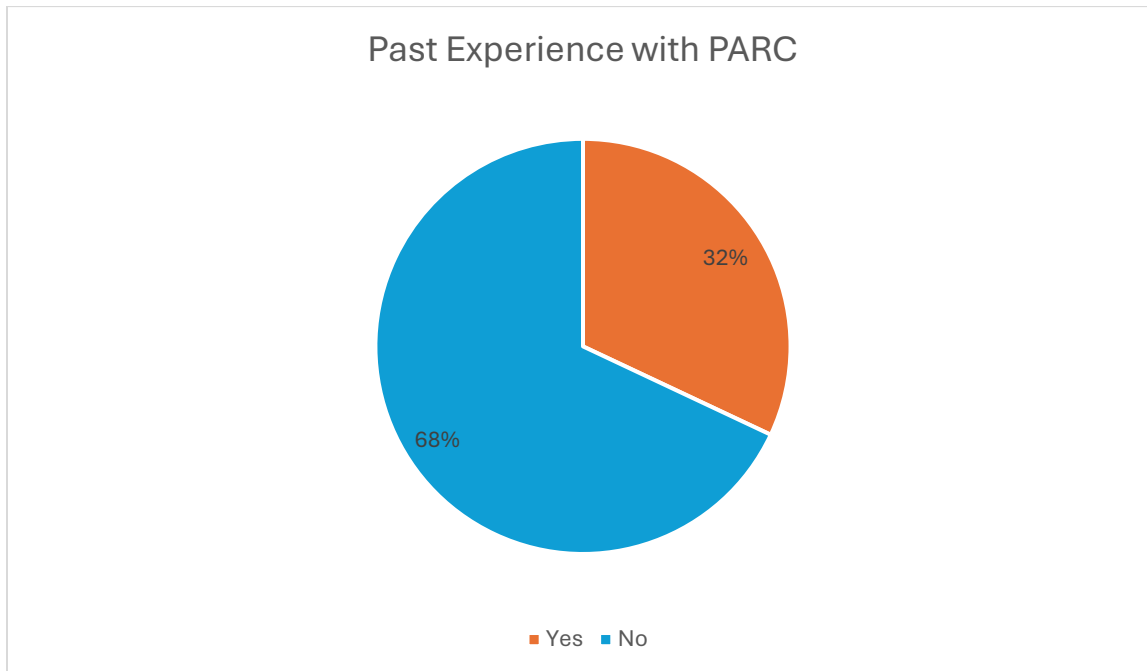

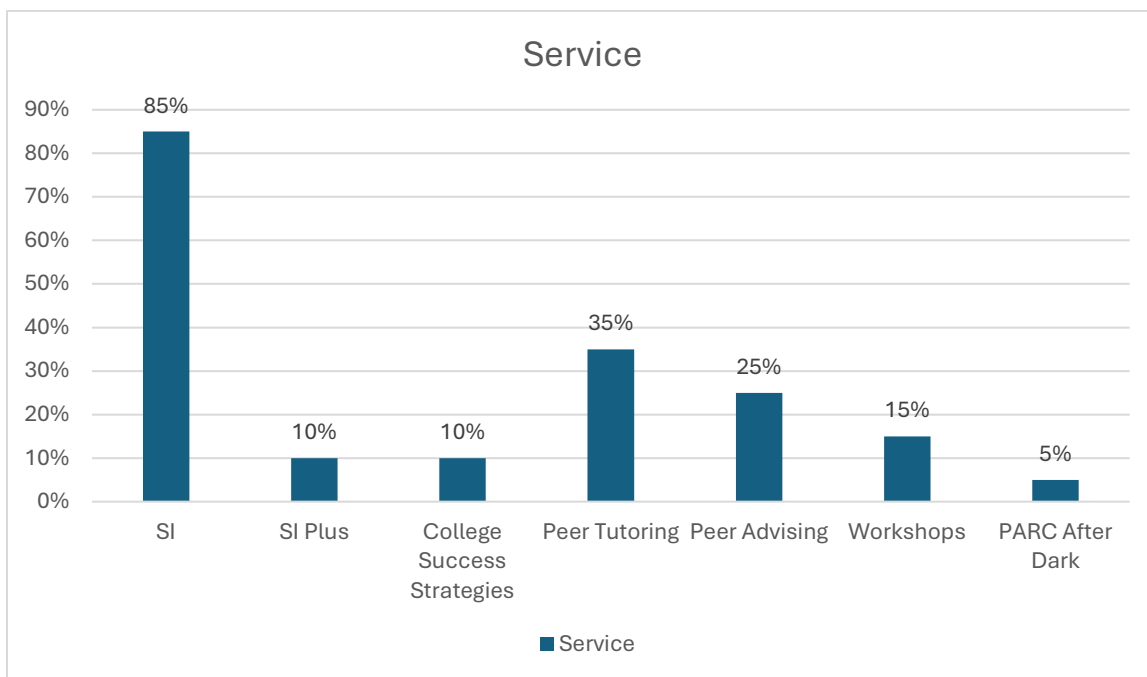

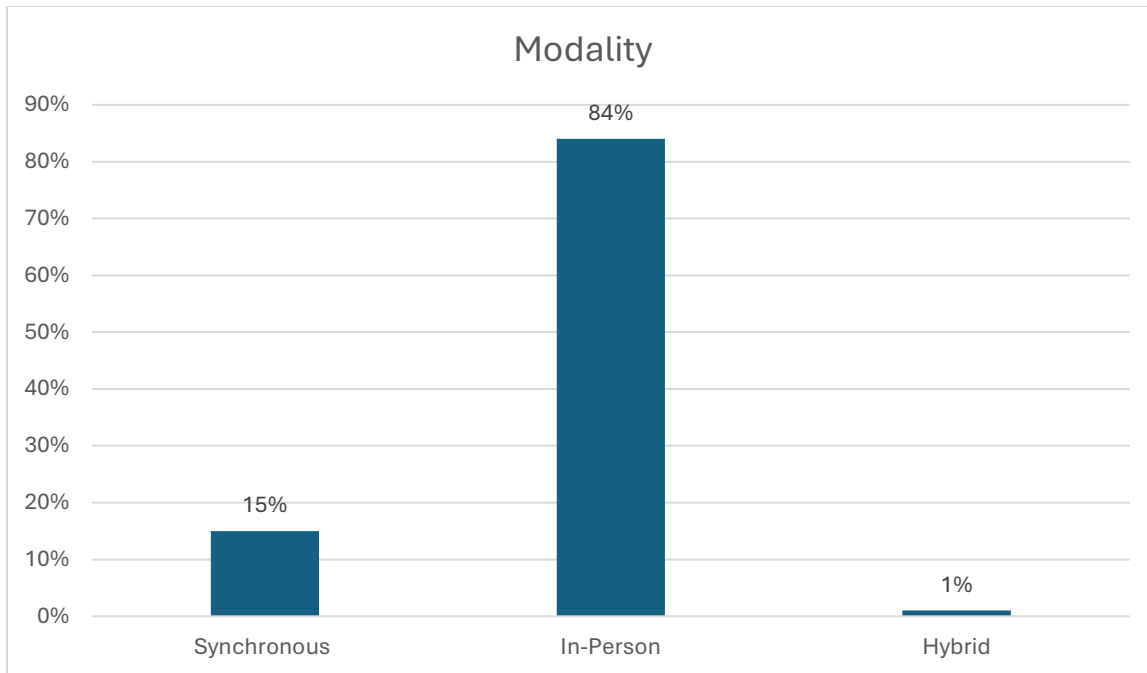

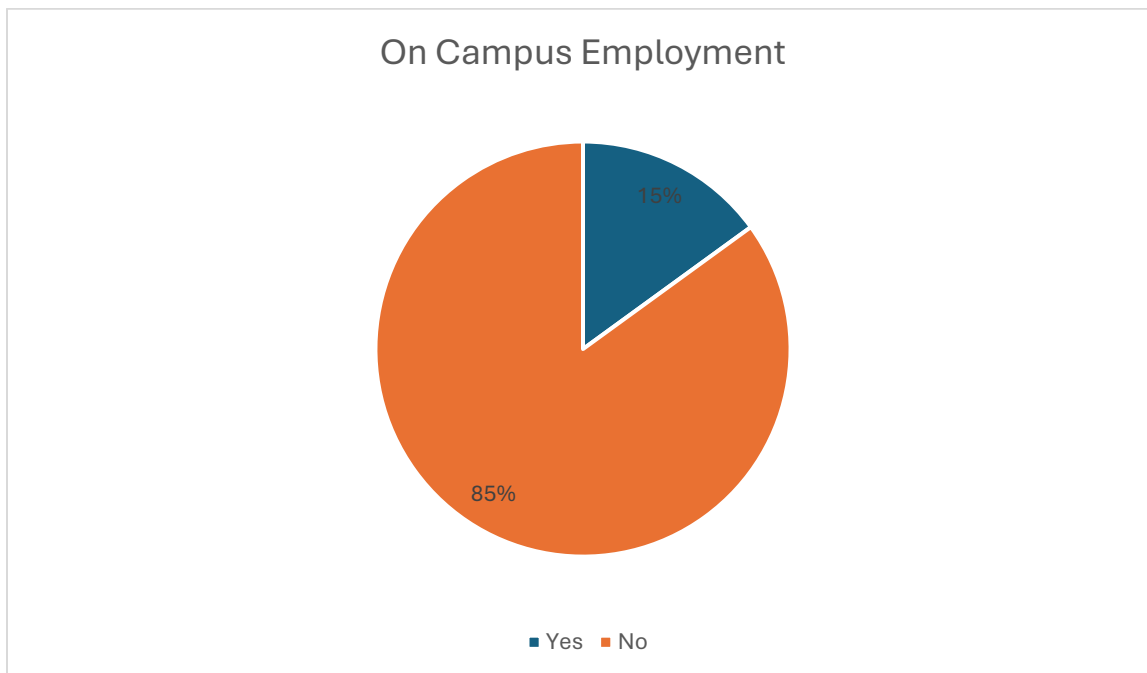


### What is the modality of the main lecture?



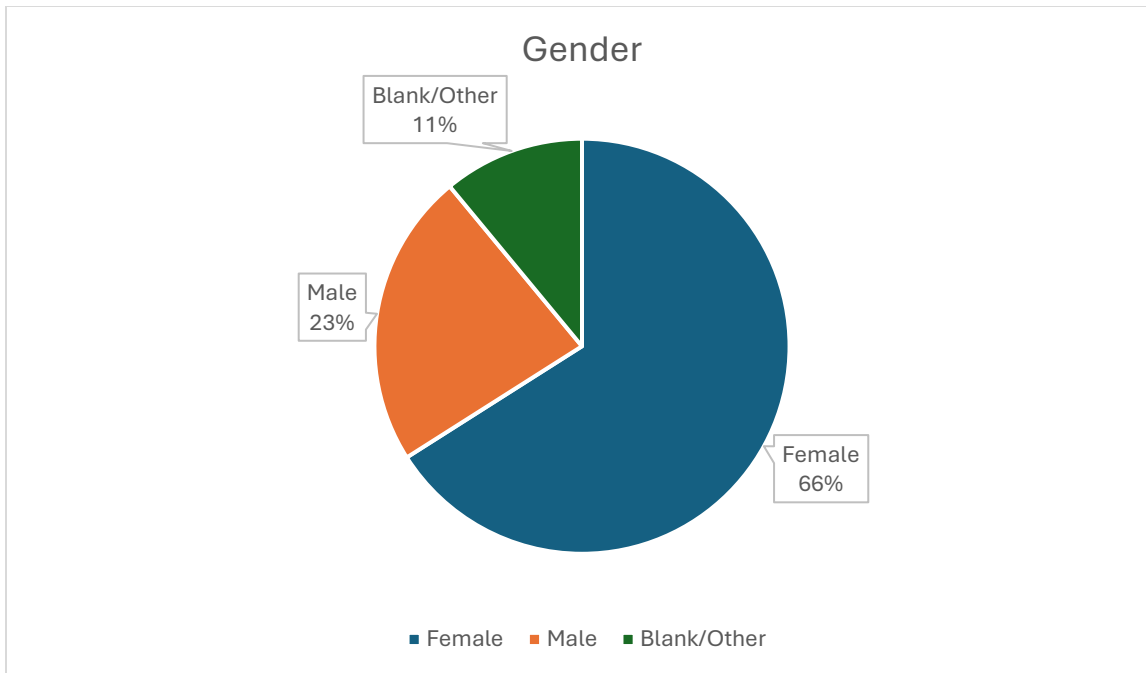
- 84% of SI students had their main lecture course in-person.

### Are you a student employee working on campus?



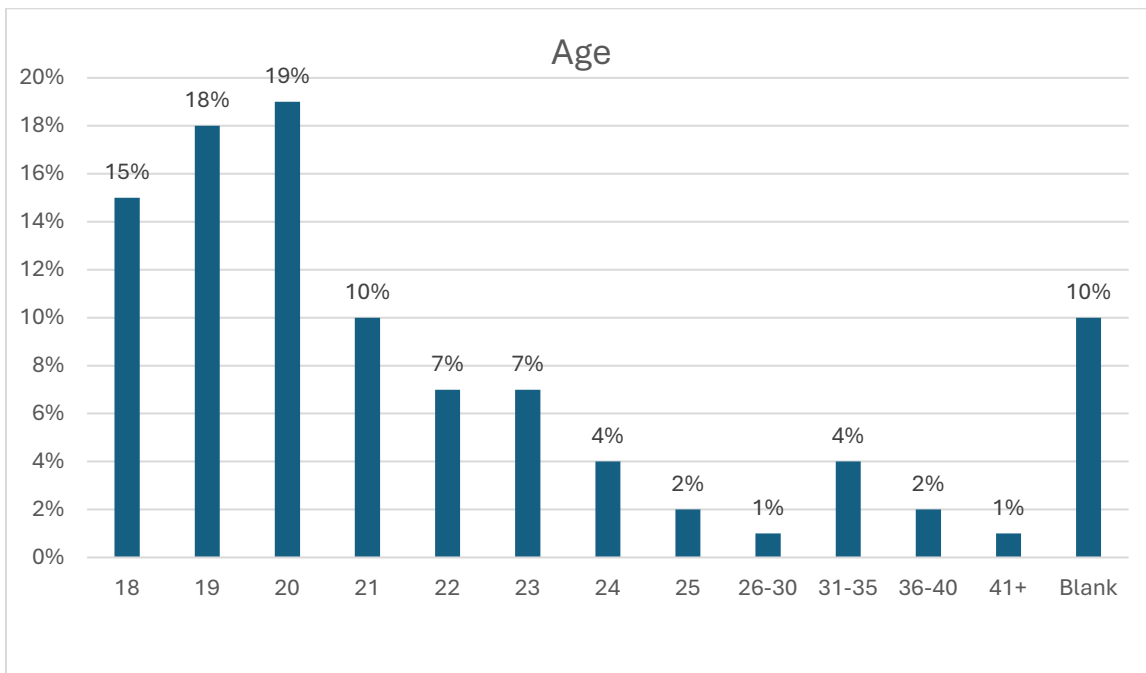
- 85% of SI students are not student employees working on campus.

**Gender**



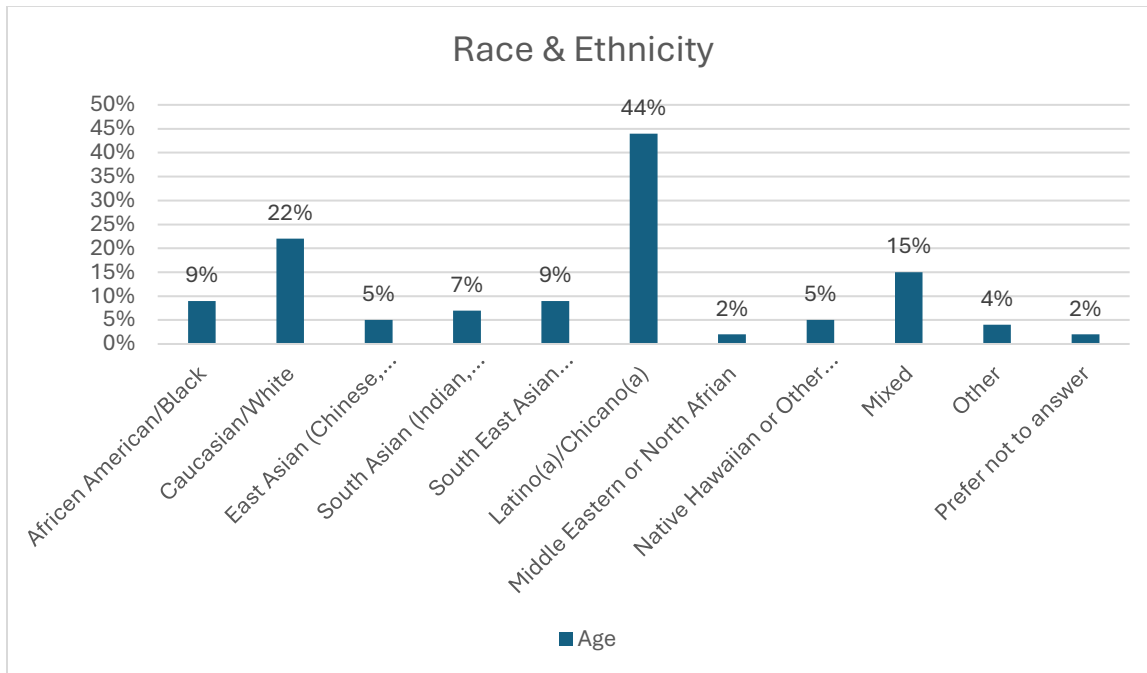
- 66% of SI students identified as female, 23% as male, and 11% as Other/Blank response.

**Age**



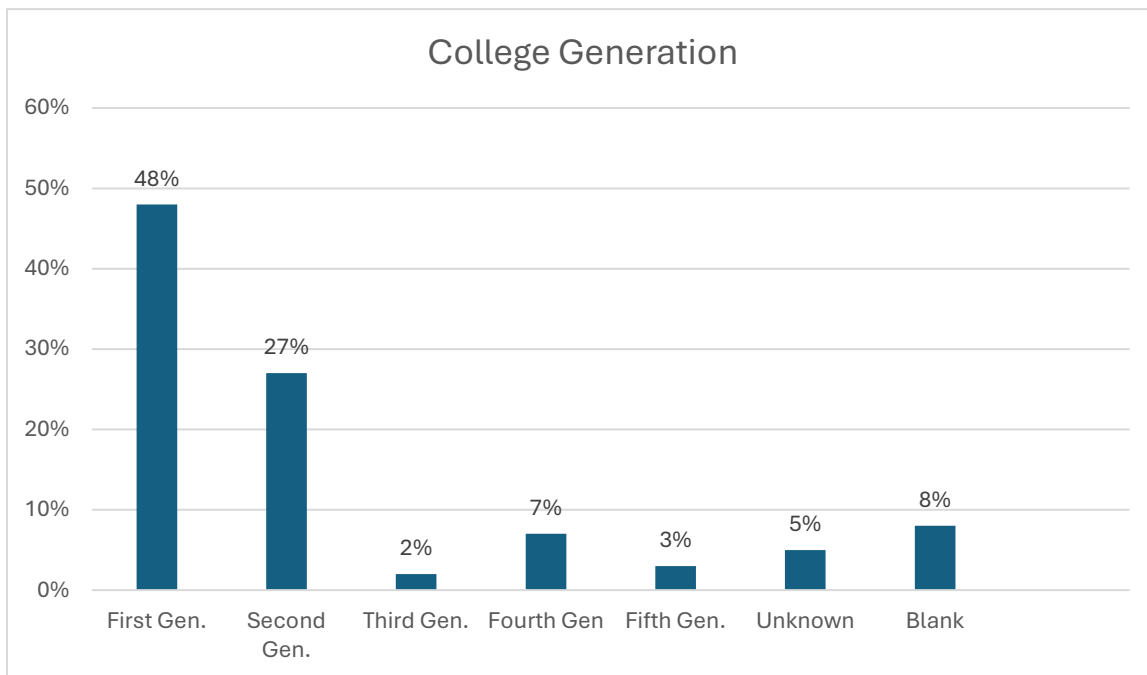
- 52% of students were between the ages of 18-20.

### Race & Ethnicity



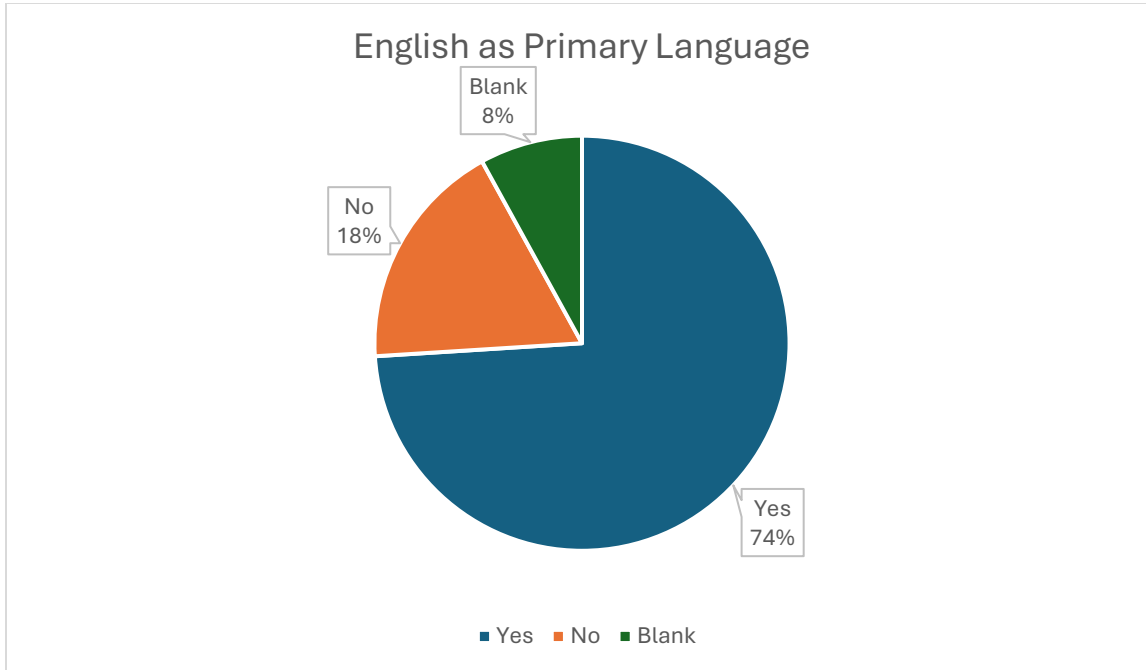
- 25% of SI students identified as Latino/Chicano, 15% identified as Caucasian/White, and 6% identified as African American/Black.

### College Generation

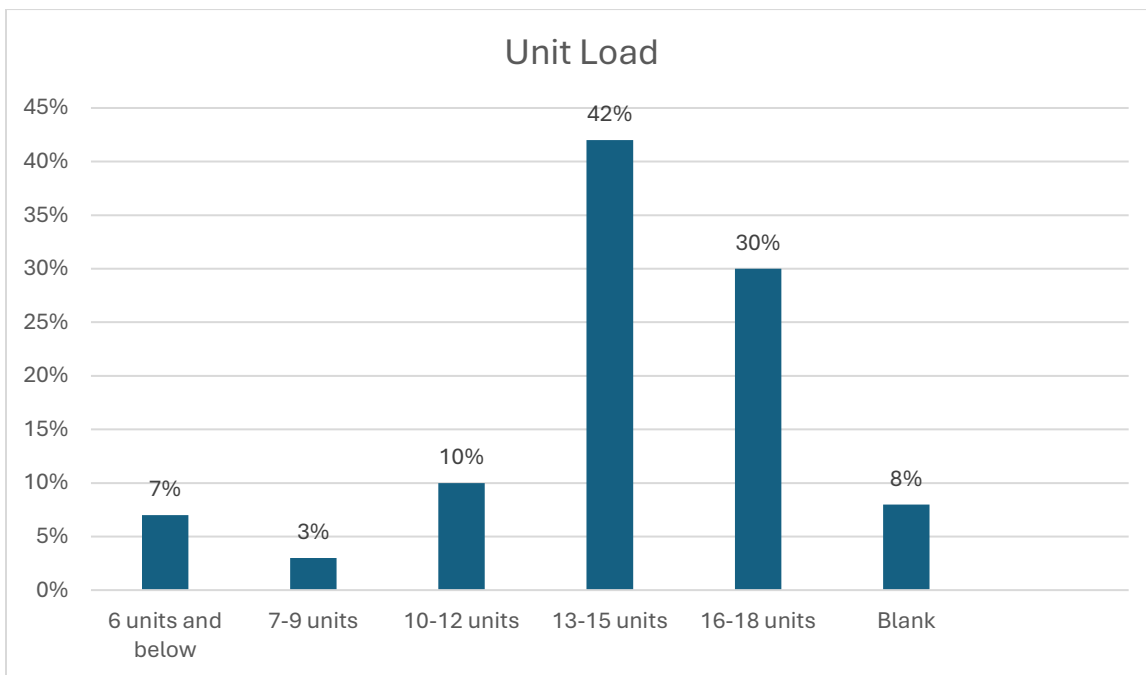


- 48% of students enrolled in SI identified as 1<sup>st</sup> generation and 27% identified as 2<sup>nd</sup> generation.

### Is English your primary language?

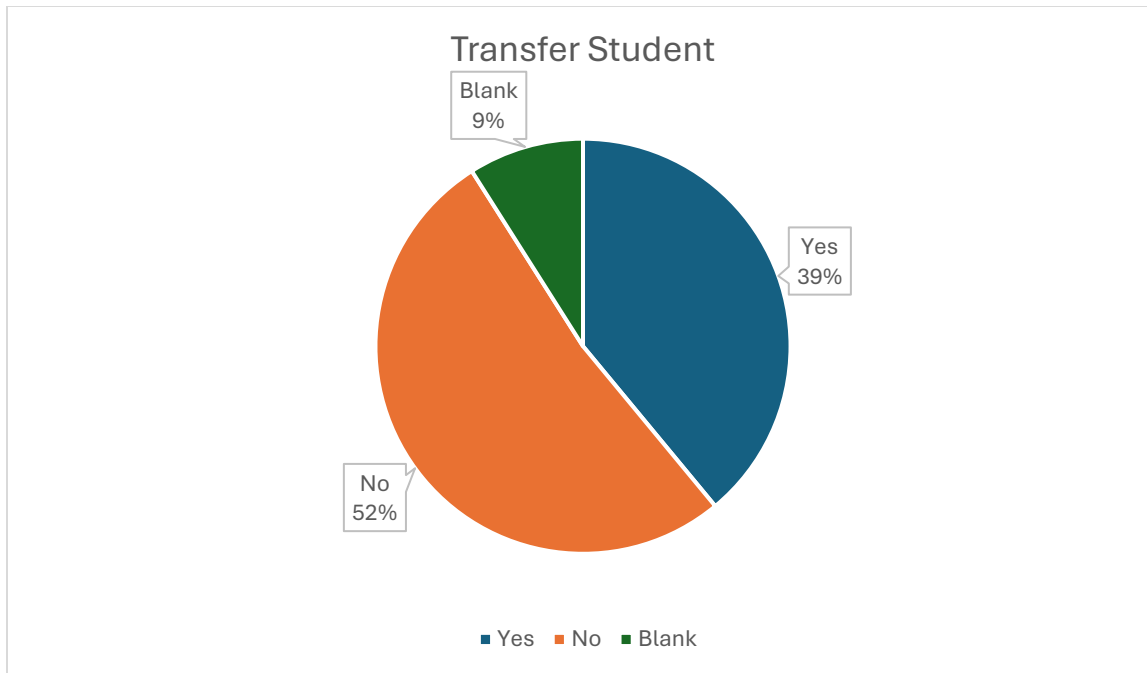


### Units



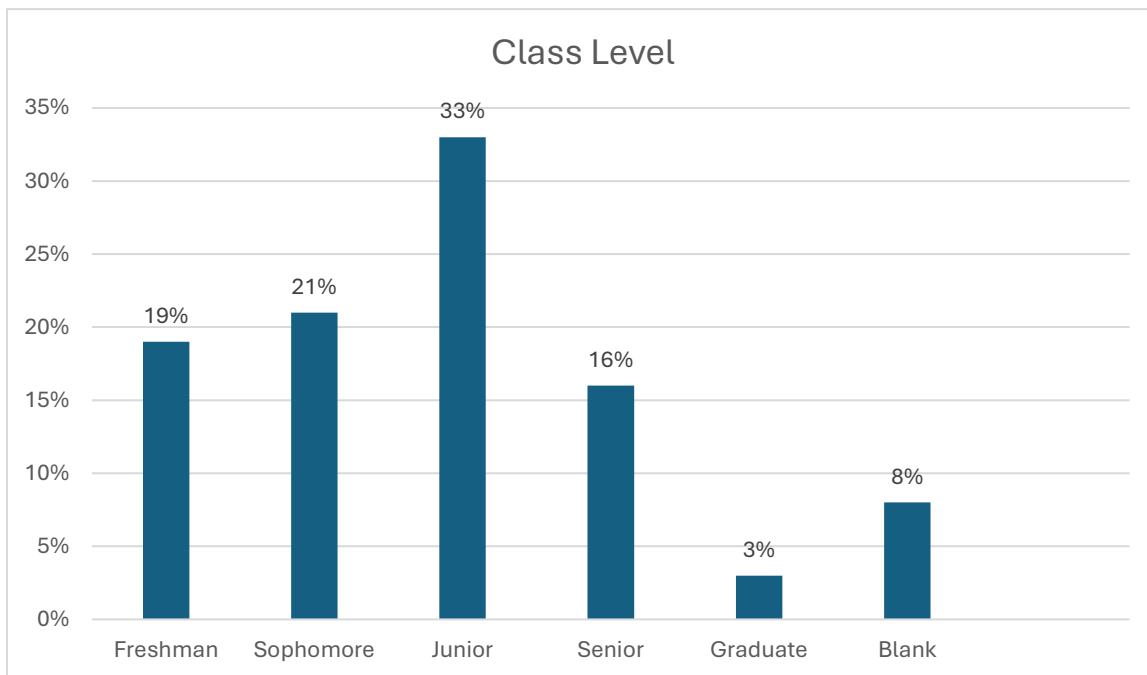
- 72% of SI students are enrolled as full-time students (13+ units)

**Are you a transfer student?**



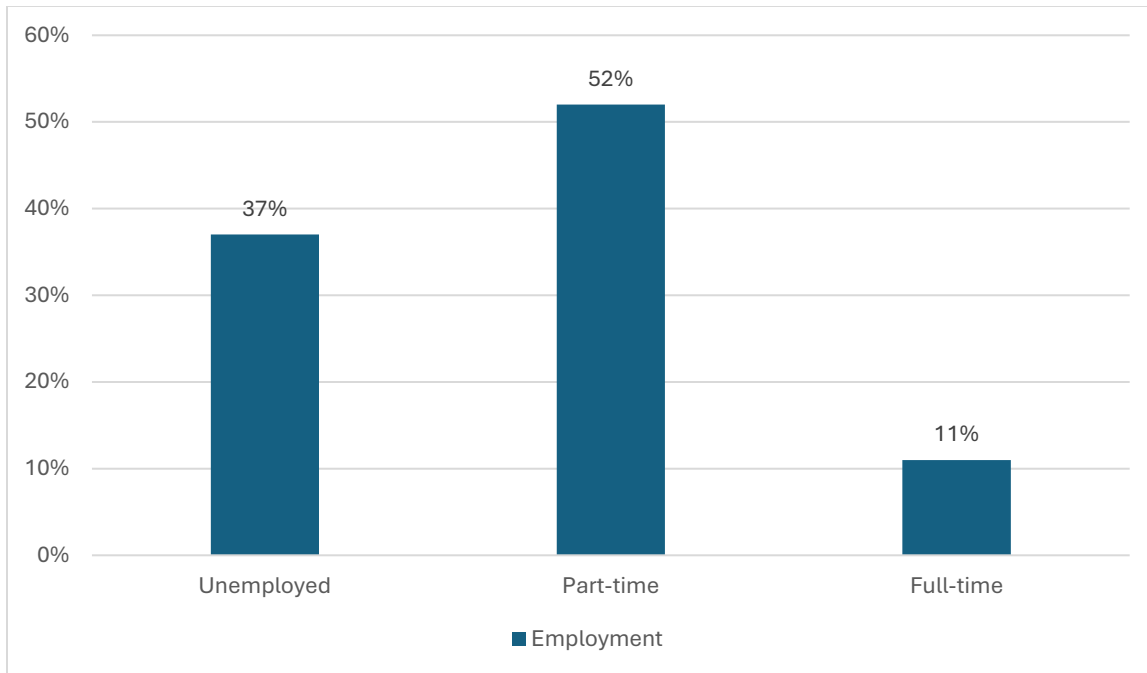
- 39% of students identified as transfer students.

**Class Level**



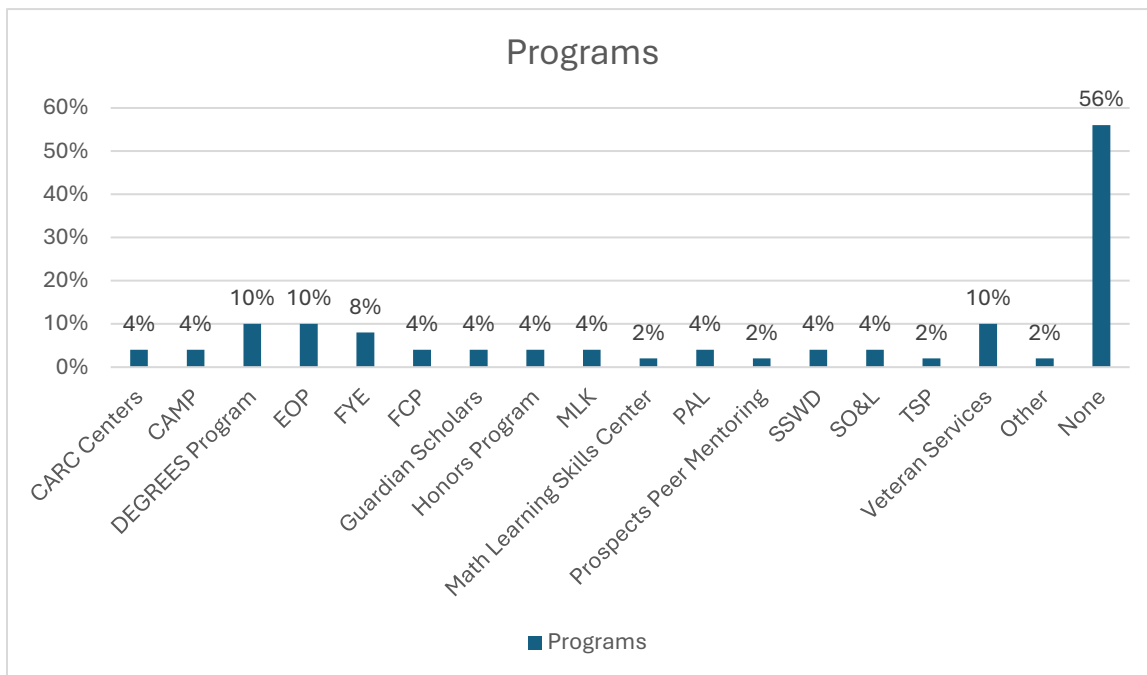
- 19% of students identified as Freshmen, 21% as Sophomores, 33% as Juniors, 16% as Seniors, and 3% as Graduate students.
