#### Justification for course proposal:

This Form A is to formalize an expansion of the Beer Tourism course that has informally taken place since the course was created. The course was originally proposed as a 1-unit course capitalizing on the popularity of craft beer as part of the wine tourism course. The content of the course immediately expanded and was essentially a three-unit course being taught with only 1-unit as identifiable credit. The standard practice was for students to take two units of RPTA 199 with the one-unit version of RPTA 188. This allowed them to have appropriate units to complete all of the associated work and give the students three-units of elective credit. Making the course into a three-unit class is a more appropriate way to give credit for the work and also have it show appropriately

This Form A also corrects the course's title which always contained the word "industry." However, that word was left out when the course was originally entered in the Sac State catalog and CMS. When CourseLeaf replaced the old catalog, the incorrect title remained.

RPTA 188: Sacramento Region Craft Beer Industry Tourism, is part of the department's agritourism-related offerings, complimenting RPTA 189: California Wine and Agritourism, and RPTA 187: Gastronomic Tourism.

Introduction to visitation and tourism related to California's craft beer industry, specifically in the Sacramento region. This course will provide students with a basic knowledge of craft beer as one of several local products that combine to create a unique agritourism selling proposition for Sacramento. Tourism-related products (beer festivals and contests, beer trails, beer bikes, and beer apps), hospitality (brewery tasting rooms and beer retail), as well as beer laws, and beer pairings will also be discussed.

- 12. Compare and contrast craft beer organizations based on local government involvement.
- 13. Show evidence of networking with California Craft Brewers (through a class assignment).
