Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

A new course, CHDV 128: Combined Research Methods in Human Development, was created to contain core content in two CHDV methods courses: CHDV 123 (Qualitative) and CHDV 133 (Quantitative). The two methods courses are required for majors, and currently minors need to take only CHDV 133, thus inadequately preparing them for some upper division coursework in CHDV. The proposal is to require the combined course rather than CHDV 133. This proposal adds CHDV 128 as meeting the methods prerequisite. Alternatively, students can meet the methods prerequisite by taking both CHDV 123 (qualitative) and CHDV 133 (quantitative) methods courses in place of CHDV 128.
