The minor provides the ideal avenue for students to hone their intellectual skills and apply their education in the real world. Building upon the campus commitment to global education and interdisciplinary study, the coursework invites students to explore ideas beyond the boundaries of their majors and to engage in a scholarly conversation with the broad university community. Students who complete the minor should truly be lifelong learners who view themselves and engage as global citizens and leaders.

Objectives of the degree program:

- To provide students with an expanded upper division Honors curriculum focused on applying knowledge learned in the classroom to the real world.
- To master applying knowledge and skills across more than one discipline to solving world problems.
- To encourage personal and social responsibility including civic knowledge and engagement, intercultural knowledge and competence, ethical reasoning, and life-long learning

Minimum GPA Requirement

To be admitted to the GE Honors Program incoming freshmen must have a minimum H.S. GPA of 3.5 or higher, 27 on the ACT or 1180 on the SAT. Current students and transfer students may apply to the Honors Program with a cumulative college GPA of 3.5 or higher. Once accepted into the minor students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

Katherine Chalmers (chalmers) (Wed, 15 May 2019 18:35:48 GMT):Rollback: The "Additional Requirements" section is unclear as written. For example, does an Honors student have to go abroad in order to receive this minor? As written, it appears to be another requirement of the minor, but it also could be interpreted as study abroad experience can waive some of the minor unit requirements here on campus? There are different GPA requirements for admission listed in the proposal as well as in the attached files (GE Honors Minor in Global Engagement and Leadership.docx) which leads to confusion. In addition, the Subcommittee has previously NOT allowed other programs on campus to require a higher GPA for transfer students than they do for "native" students for admission into honors programs. The unit total is ambiguous for the degree program. The proposal lists 21 units, but the attached files list 18?
