6. Students will develop an understanding for how to conceptualize client presentation based on theory, as well as how to use theory to select appropriate counseling interventions.
7. Students will examine their own values and personal beliefs/assumptions about people and gain insight into the relationships between personal beliefs, theory, and practice in counseling.
8. Students practice counseling techniques through role-play and sharing personal thoughts within their dyad/triad, and giving/receiving feedback through their dyads and supervision.

4. Session Video, Transcript, and Final Evaluation (ELO 1-7)

You will submit this video along with a transcription of the session for your final evaluation. The video will be scored according to the 18 Counseling Skills Scale. In order to earn credit for this evaluation, students must score at least a 3 on all 18 skills. A grade of No Credit on this assignment will result in a grade of No Credit for the class.
