Justification for course proposal:

In response to the recent Child Development program review, the Child Development faculty have reviewed the concentrations within the major with the aim of identifying areas for change and re-development of the concentrations. One finding of the program review was the need of more support for degree to career trajectory and identification of student interest and community needs regarding child development careers. The Child Development program has long served students interested in working with children and adolescents outside the classroom context, particularly in social and community settings and in preparation for graduate studies. To respond directly to the concern for support for this degree trajectory, an additional fieldwork course in the early stages of students' educational careers that provides a more explicit career exploration and preparation, with translation of theory into practice in community and social settings, is proposed.

This course aims to identify professional opportunities in the field of child and adolescent development through fieldwork, interviews with professionals, and other class activities. Students will leave the class with professional career materials and a greater understanding of career trajectories in the field.

This course aims to prepare students to become familiar with the operations of organizations serving children and adolescents in the community and identify professional opportunities in the field of child and adolescent development through class activities and 40 hours of fieldwork. Students will engage in directed field experiences in community and social settings and attend an on campus seminar. Students will translate theory into practice and reflect on experiences. Issues on equity and diversity within human development will be discussed.
