- 10. Students will analyze the impact of trauma on children, families, communities, and those with disabilities.
- 11. Students will develop emergency management plans for crises and disasters.
- 12. Students will apply techniques, through experiments, role-plays, and sharing personal thoughts and ideas.
- 13. Students will analyze and apply Mental Health Recovery-Oriented Care and Resiliency through Case Management and application within Systems of Care.
