Your course proposal has been approved by the committee pending revisions to the learning outcomes and assessment strategies. The committee would ask you to reconsider the structure of your learning outcomes. For example, the first learning outcome should be divided into two as applying and analyzing are two different outcomes. 1) apply and analyze content knowledge appropriate to the study of filmed and filmic adaptation of drama. (Perhaps I reveal my own ignorance with this question, but what is "content knowledge"? It might be useful to be more specific here so that students know to what you are referring?) In respect to moving the proposal successfully through the next levels of committees you might consider referring to Bloom's Taxonomy in order to select appropriate action verbs for the varying types and levels of learning that you expect of the students. Once you have formulated the learning outcomes please be certain to reformat the assessment strategies so that they are coordinated with the outcomes.
